The six semester Marketing program is also responsible for operating the Sparta Mart, Sentinel's two-location school store. The store functions as a "learning laboratory" that benefits marketing students by providing them with real-world experiences that will enhance their future professional opportunities. In addition, students enrolling in Marketing III & IV have the option of Dual Enrollment in BGEN 105, Introduction to Business, and can earn 3 college credits through the University of Montana.

- Students will receive hands-on experience working in teams to produce multimedia and print coverage of SHS and the local community.
- Students will gain experience working in professional quality broadcast studio, producing
 weekly newscasts as well as three hours of original programming each week to be aired on
 MCAT.
- Students may receive up to 15 credits at the University of Montana through the School of Journalism, School of Media Arts and the Missoula College.
- Students in the Video Broadcast Journalism and Spartan TV will work with PBS NewsHour and Montana PBS to produce documentaries for the national stage.
- Students will cover stories for digital and print news operations and keep the daily pulse on the SHS community.
