## Operations Levy on the Ballot-

Elementary Operations Levy (Grades K-8)

- Projected levy of \$181,000 (one year only)
- Cost: \$2.23 per year based on a \$100,000 assessed property value
- Cost: \$4.45 per year based on a \$200,000 assessed property value

■ Provides funding for elementary and middle school instruction materials and supplies, extra-curricular programs, employees' salaries and benefits, electricity, natural gas, and water.

### **Returning Your Ballot-**

The May 6, 2014 election is a mail ballot election. If you are a voter that lives in the MCPS Elementary District, your ballot will include one levy and trustee seats. If you live in the High School District (and your community is served by a different K-8 school district), your ballot will only include one trustee seat.

Ballots will be mailed to voters on Monday, April 21. Ballots must be returned to election officials by 8 p.m., Tuesday, May 6, to be counted in the election. Ballots can be returned by mail or dropped off at the sites listed below.

Beginning April 21, voters can drop off ballots at the Elections Office at either:

- Missoula County Fairgrounds (enter from South Avenue and watch for signs)
- Missoula County Courthouse Annex (office located on second floor)
