NO DECEMBER BOOK FAIR

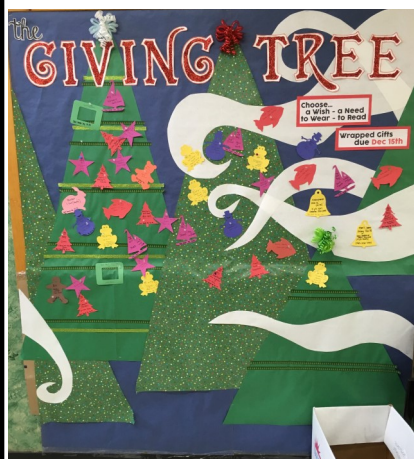

From the Principal's Office

Dear Parents,

December is upon us and with this month comes many holiday events. Schedules get really busy and hectic. It is important to keep in mind regular bedtimes for students during the month of December. Late nights and less sleep will affect students stamina in class, if too many late night activities are on the schedule.

The first week in December will be an exciting time for several classes. Mrs. Dungan, Mrs. Sharkey, Mrs. Hendrson/Mrs. Vanek, and Mrs. Greil will move into their new classrooms in the North wing. Final punch lists are currently being completed as Phase One of our remodel comes to completion. With the start of Phase Two, we will temporarily relocat Mr. Aune's classroom and Ms. Hougard's classroom from the NorthEast section of the building to the South wing. All the moves are scheduled to take place December 6th and 7th. We will try to be as efficient with the moves as possible, but know it can be a bit unsettling to students. Teachers will work hard to get moves completed and schedules back to normal as soon as possible with the goal being the least amount of disruption to learning. After these moves take place, Mrs. Langella's classroom will be moved to a temporary space in the library, so work on our new cafeteria space and administration area can begin. Myself and Mrs. Myers, our counselor, will also be relocating to temporary spaces, for the next few months.

I realize disruptions to our normal traffic patterns around and through the school cause some confusion and a bit of disequilibrium with the construction in our midst. I do see students and teachers being resilient and so accommodating. I continue to be thankful for everyone's patience and understanding as the construction continues. We are doing everything we can to ensure the project stays on a timeline with completion before the opening of the 2019-20 school year.

As I conclude this month, I want to let you all know I will be retiring at the end of the 2018-19 school year. I am so grateful I was lucky enough to grow up in the very community I have been so fortunate to be directly involved with during most of my tenure with Missoula County Public Schools. I will be forever grateful for the wonderful teachers I experienced during my childhood years at Lewis and Clark. They surely influenced me to pursue a path in education. The staff and parents in the Lewis and Clark community are knowledgeable and committed to high performing schools for active, compassionate and life-long learners. The acquaintances and friendships developed throughout this community, I will treasure. With the completion of the remodel of Lewis and Clark Elementary in the summer of 2019, this is the right time for the school community to transition to a new leader, who will take Lewis and Clark into the future.

Thanks so much for supporting the sale of Coffee, Toffee, Tea, and More. We had over \$29,000 in sales, which will bring in a **profit of almost \$15,000** for Lewis & Clark's PTA.

Counselor's Corner: A Note from Ms. Myers

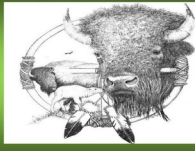

Winter Weather - School Delays and Cancellations

Lewis and Clark families:

We are fast approaching the winter season and the heart of Missoula winter weather. I want to make sure you know where to find information regarding any weather related delays or cancellations to our normal school schedule.

When school is delayed or cancelled due to weather, it is our District's goal to notify families, students and the public by 6:30 a.m.

This decision is based on input from local law enforcement, our transportation partner Beach Transportation, and our own staff research of current road conditions.



We post notifications about delays or cancellations on our district website homepage at www.mcpsmt.org. This information will also be posted on each school's website homepage. We also post the information on our district Mobile App, as well as the MCPS Facebook, Twitter and Instagram accounts.

For those families that opt to receive emails, phone calls and text messages from the school, you will also receive a notice directly via phone, email and text.

Finally, you will see the information reported by local media on the radio and television as well as their own websites. When looking at reports on local media, be sure you look for notices related to Missoula County Public Schools or School District #1. Sometimes other schools in the area are affected and our 17 schools remain on normal schedules. If in doubt, check one of our MCPS websites or social media accounts.
