

What is the PYP Action Cycle?

The Action Cycle is an important part of a student's experience in an IB World School. Students are encouraged and expected to reflect on their learning, to think about a choice based on their understandings, and to take action to support their choice.

If you have noticed your child taking action as a result of his or her participation in an IB unit of inquiry, please share what you have seen or heard with us. Remember that action can be demonstrated in many ways and can include anything from a conversation about a concept, a change in behavior, to working with adults and peers to set up a fundraiser to help a cause.

To print out a Student Action Sheet you can click on the International Baccalaureate section under the "About Us" tab on the Lewis and Clark website and choose the Action Cycle tab, or take one from the IB bulletin board at the front office. Thank you for taking the time to share with us! We will display your student action sheet with our Program of Inquiry at the front entry!!!

Lewis & Clark PTA Awarded \$2400 Grant from UM Class

L&C parent Mia Hanak submitted a successful grant application on behalf of the PTA, earlier this fall to the University of Montana's Learning by Giving program to help finance and expand the recycling program at Lewis & Clark. The PTA has tried for years to find sponsors for the recycling and this grant will fund the pick up for 2 years.

Hanak, PTA president Lorie Lochridge, Lynx Service Club (LSC) parent lead Kylie Barnes and LSC members Jack Pew and Cora Barnes helped lead the UM students on a site visit to Lewis & Clark while explaining how the LSC collects recycling each week. Jack and Cora were invited to the awards ceremony at UM's Davidson's Honors College presentation and received the donation of \$2400 on behalf of the PTA.

This is the first year the Philanthropy & Social Entrepreneurship class chose the environment as a focus for grant recipients. Other Missoula non-profit's who were awarded grants included Council Grove Apartments Bee & Butterfly Garden, Garden City Harvest and Clark Fork School.

Did you know L&C collects **BoxTop\$**? There is a collection box at the front office. You can also earn money for Lewis & Clark at **The Good Food Store.** Simply tell the cashier you would like to donate to L&C and a percentage of your purchase is

given to the PTA. Write L&C PTA on the top of Missoula Fresh Market receipt and hand to cashier.

At the end of September, the fifth-grade classes conducted an experiment for three days in the lunch room to collect data on how much waste we students create during a lunch period.

- In total, we produced 34.5 lbs of paper waste,
- 36 lbs of plastic waste
- 73 lbs of liquid waste, •
- 175 lbs of food waste, and 1
- 1.5 lbs of unrecyclable material.

That's a total of a whopping **330lbs of waste** that is being thrown directly into our city dump, and that's only from 3 days!!

There are a few things we would like everyone to consider for the future when heading into the lunchroom;

- Try to choose foods that you will actually eat. Pick a fruit that you enjoy instead of a pile of olives that you may only eat 3 of.
- Think about using containers that you can wash and reuse, instead of throwing away your plastic bags every day.
- Take your time to eat. We're growing kids that NEED nourishment to fuel our bodies to help us perform our best in all of our activities, in and out of school.
- And lastly, remember to thank the lunch staff. They work very hard to make sure we're leaving the lunchroom full and ready to take on the rest of the day.

We hope we can all do our part to reduce waste here at L&C and continue to help our environment!
