From the Principal's Office:



Dear Parents,

Happy Fall. We had a marvelous turn out for our Open House/Ice Cream Social. Students were so excited to show their classrooms to parents and family members. The night was beautiful and I enjoyed reconnecting with so many families. Thank you for your support of our school and the many activities held throughout the year. We have a strong Parent Teacher Association and invite you to join and take an active role in working alongside the staff to partner with a vibrant team focused on the success of every child at Lewis and Clark.

The remodeling and construction work is concentrated in three main areas of the school grounds. The North core, the South end, and the Northwest side of the building. Crews are trying to get concrete footings poured before the cold weather comes. I realize pathways around the building are a bit more challenging. Safety is of the utmost importance to us. Should you notice something unsafe, please don't hesitate to phone me and share your concern. We want to be sure students are safe at all times.

Throughout all classrooms we are beginning to implement our new Language Arts Curriculum. Classrooms are incorporating a structure for their 90 minute ELA block called the Daily 5. Teachers and students have been setting up the daily routines and building community as they instill literacy habits that allow for independence. Teachers are also doing diagnostic assessments and students are building their independent reading stamina. As classrooms increase the thoughtful, sustained independent work in the Daily 5 structure, teachers will be rolling out the board adopted Pearson ReadyGen Reading materials to support an integrated, well-balanced approach to reading and writing instruction. Students are currently finishing up the first of three, STAR Reading and Math screening assessments. Reports will help guide teacher decisions about instruction, support and the scaffolding each student will need to be successful in reading and math instruction.

As we move into fall weather with colder temperatures, please send students with warm clothing. **It is very helpful, if you label all outerwear with your child's name.** Many articles of clothing end up in the Lost and Found. Our goal is to return your child's clothing to you. We do display lost and found items at the end of the month. Unclaimed items (a substantial amount) are bagged and donated to various groups in the community. We do not have the capacity nor room to store lost and found items throughout the year.

October and the beautiful fall colors of Montana are on display in our Outdoor Discovery Core. I invite you to walk with your child/children and notice nature's wonders in our school yard habitat.

Lewis & Clark or give them our school "prefix" code of 334. They will send 3% of your purchase to L&C. They also have a committee that reviews online forms for special donation requests once a month for special events.

Background checks are valid for 2 years.

Volunteers will be classified as Supervised or Unsupervised.

- **Unsupervised volunteers** are cleared for student contact with or without the presence/supervision of an MCPS employee (i.e. teacher, administrator).
- **Supervised volunteers** are cleared only for student contact in the presence/supervision of an MCPS employee or approved program supervisor.
