### Construction Update

The weeks are flying by and we have a new construction update – things have really changed since the last update!

The North pods have been completed in terms of iron work and roof decking and are ready for the roofer as soon as the weather cooperates (it is snowing at the moment!).

The South pod has a couple days of iron work and a couple days of roof decking and will then be ready for roofing also. The work in the existing building is going very well – we are placing underground plumbing for the new rest rooms and will soon begin demoing walls in the South wing near the kitchen. Overall, we are moving right along! Thank you for your cooperation and understanding through this process, it is appreciated.

### Connect 5 Messages

Thank you for letting us know that Connect 5 phone calls are helpful to you! Russell School utilizes this system to share information and reminders. When you receive these calls, please listen to the message. You can end the call at any time, and at the end of each call is an option to opt out. Many parents hang up before listening to the message and then call the school wondering what the call was about. This floods Ms. Kelly, our Secretary with additional phone calls, and can be very overwhelming.



#### Head Lice

Since head lice is not uncommon in school age children, the district wants to remind parents of resources and the school procedures which are located on the district website (<a href="www.mcpsmt.org">www.mcpsmt.org</a>) =>student services =>head lice. You may also contact the family resource centers or the school nurse for written information or resources.

Remember that:

- People usually don't have symptoms of having head lice for several weeks after becoming infested. A common symptom is itching which is also common with dandruff and dry skin.
- People get head lice from other infested people mostly when they have head to head contact as head lice do not fly, swim or jump.
- It's easier to treat head lice when found "early" so checking hair for head lice at home is important for any symptoms or even periodically.
