Areas of Focus: Ensure college and career readiness by creating a common district vision and a CTE leadership position. Ensuring programs and standards are aligned with labor and industry needs. Review pathways and ensure connections between education and the workforce are being made. Copies of the CTE audit were given to all members of the advisory board.
