## Homework

Kindergarten doesn't usually have homework. 5-6 year-olds need to play outside, experience the world and enrichment activities, hear stories, and enjoy their family each night. You may receive a "family homework" activity from time to time, but not daily or weekly. If your child is ill or misses school, I will put the practice paperwork (usually handwriting) in their folder for them to complete, as your child is able, **and return**. If you know your child will be gone for an extended period of time, please check in as I might be able to put together a packet for them in advance. But mostly, Kindergarten is a hands-on learning experience that can't always be replicated outside the classroom.
