Classroom Visits

Animal Wonders

Amazing animal ambassadors come to visit students in an enriching environment. Kids don't even know they're learning as they meet, greet, and hear each animal's story. Montana Natural History Center

Bring a naturalist to you! They meet your class at school or at another location of your choice—including local natural areas. They bring naturalist tools like binoculars, spotting scopes, insect nets, specimens, and other materials to help excite your students' curiosity and connect them with nature.

Fort Missoula Historical Museum

Students learn about 1877 homesteader life. Guided tours try their hand at washing clothes the old fashioned way, pressing apples using a simple machine, experience a lesson in a 1 room schoolhouse or visit the fire lookout.
