1.2 WHY ROMAN EMPIRE COLLAPSED

- <u>Political Instability:</u> Rome never figured out how to choose new leaders in a peaceful way. People physically fought for the crown or the emperor's private army chose who the next leader would be.
- <u>Economic & Social Problems:</u> citizens had to pay heavy taxes. This hurt their economy, made people poorer & caused trade to suffer, Corruption was a huge issue (illegal actions of the government), leaders wasted a lot of money, crime made life unsafe, & people lost their sense of loyalty (lack of citizenship)._
- Weakening Frontiers: The Empire was so large that it made it hard to defend from enemies.

1.3 Roman Art

- Ancient Roman Art: Mosaics, murals, frescoes (3D), cameos, glass blowing, statues/sculptures, gem cutting, metalwork.
- Influences on modern life: Jewelry (wedding rings), welded art, statues (Liberty), crowns w/ jewels, murals at restaurants (Café Dolche), paintings on electrical boxes, mosaics at the airport.































1.4 Roman Architecture & Engineering

Architectural & engineering achievements: Aqueducts, vaults, domes, cathedrals, arches, stadium. Made concrete out of stone & water to design roads, bridges.


Influences on modern life: Churches, football stadiums, capitol buildings, banks, highways, freeways, canals










