

RAISE A BODY POSITIVE KID

INSTEAD OF THIS:

- Commenting on appearance
- Negative comments on your own body
- Exercising for appearance
- Focusing on weight
- Commenting on someone else's body, shape, size



TRY THIS:

- + Commenting on talents
- + Positive comments about your qualities/abilities
- + Exercise for enjoyment
- + Focus on health/wellness
- + Comment on some else's talents, kindness, personality

Can you remember the first time you had a negative thought about your body? Believe it or not, kids as young as toddler age are starting to make comments about their own self image. Positive self-talk is a practice, just like anything else. It isn't always easy and it takes time, but it is worth it for your own mental health and for your kids personal development. Body positivity isn't just for girls. Boys are also easily influenced by negative self-talk. Today I encourage you to say a few positive things about yourself and the people around you. Let your kids hear all the great things you (and they!) can do.

Plaque Honors Longtime Teacher and Peace Maker: Jane McAllister



Jane taught kindergarten, fourth grade, fifth, and physical education at Lewis and Clark for years. Jane accompanied 5th graders on Heritage tours to Washington, DC. She also accompanied many L&C MCT plays as the pianist. She is a fitness enthusiast and worked to get kids active by organizing morning movement, training runs for the Riverbank Run. She helped kids log their miles so they could “run” collectively to NYC and “run” the length of the Continental Divide. She procured a grant to buy fitness monitors for students. In the fall of 2004, Mrs. McAllister as a 4th grade teacher, she joined Mrs. O’Keefe and Mrs. Dungan’s multiage classes in imagining their visions of peace through writing. The three classes worked to create a song titled “Peace

Within, Peace Without “and raised several thousand dollars to help rebuild a school which had been destroyed in the Indian Ocean tsunami. This was the beginning of the work that she and Mrs. Dungan’s classes would embrace each year. Together their classes imagined and created the Lewis and Clark Peace Path, and helped raise money to build a school for girls in Pakistan through Pennies for Peace. Imagining peace through the arts and making those visions come alive through actions, both big and small, would eventually grow into the Peace Choir. She was one of the founders of the Peace Choir and still accompanies their rehearsals and performances. Mrs. McAllister retired in 2018. A plaque in her honor hangs on a rock on the Peace Path.

The words come from a song performed by the Peace Choir:

Jane McAllister: “Be Who are. Give What you have. Do what you can.”

FREE HOUR OF CODE

Lewis and Clark will host the Hour of Code in December!



Hour of Code is an opportunity for every child to learn how the technology around us works with fun, easy-to-follow games that introduce students to the world of coding using familiar characters from Angry Birds, Star Wars, Frozen, Minecraft, Moana, and more.

Lewis and Clark will again join the worldwide Hour of Code movement, hosting free after-school workshops for students in grades 2-5. Sessions will be divided into groups for students who have never coded before, and students who have had some exposure to coding - either past Hour of Code workshops, EAST coding clubs, coding camps, coding at home, etc.

Spaces will fill up so please register early for one of the one-hour sessions.

Monday, December 2nd, 3:00-4:00 -- **2nd and 3rd graders** who have **not** coded before or who have had limited coding exposure.

Tuesday, December 3rd, 3:30-4:30 -- **4th and 5th graders** who have **not** coded before or who have had limited coding exposure.

Monday, December 9th, 3:00-4:00 -- **2nd and 3rd graders** who have had prior exposure to coding.

Tuesday, December 10th, 3:30-4:30 -- **4th and 5th graders** who have had prior exposure to coding.

All sessions will be held in the Lewis and Clark computer lab after school. After-school snacks will be provided by the Lewis & Clark PTA. Lewis and Clark parents Jeremy Brown and Kathryn Grady are organizing the sessions and will be confirming your students' enrollment on a rolling basis.

Did You Know?

Kindergarten classes here at Lewis and Clark begin many of their mornings with Creative Movement? This is where the kindergarten teachers team up with each other and teach the curriculum with movement. This is a great example of Arts



Integration- using the art of dance to teach curriculum kindergarten students learn throughout the year. For example, students may be exploring the levels that dancers move, while showing an emotion during a Unit of Inquiry on self regulation skills. Arts Integration is a powerful teaching strategy that strengthens student learning. If you have a kindergartener try asking them what they did/learned in Creative Movement this week!
