

#### **HOLIDAY LYNX LITERACY TIPS**

- 1. Have your child help you make grocery lists and read recipes for special meals or treats.

#### Inquiry Corner with Kari Henderson



At Lewis and Clark we use the PYP transdisciplinary themes, which are used by teachers worldwide, to create a Program of Inquiry or POI. Students at Lewis and Clark will participate in at least 36 units of inquiry as they move from Kindergarten through Grade Five. This POI is made up of six "Units of Inquiry" per grade level:

- Who we are
- Where we are in place and time
- How we express ourselves
- How the world works
- How we organize ourselves

Sharing the planet

Each unit of inquiry is developed by grade-level and specialist teams using our state standards to address a central idea.

Ask your child what unit of inquiry they are working on!

#### Counselor's Corner: A Note from Ms. Myers

Growth Mindset is the belief that intelligence and skills are developed and changing over time. Fixed Mindset is the belief that we are born with a certain amount of intelligence and skills and that can't change. Part of developing GROWTH mindset is how we (teacher and parents) react to children as they work through challenging situations (academic or social). Giving kids specific feedback is a key piece of growing their growth mindset.

Instead of saying "GOOD JOB" or "YOU ARE SO SMART" try saying:

You didn't give up, even when it was tricky.

You worked well with your classmates, nice teamwork!

You have really improved on \_\_\_\_!

It was brave of you to \_\_\_\_!

I can tell you tried your best because \_\_\_

You remembered to (specific skill) \_\_\_\_\_! Great job remembering that!

I admire that way you

I noticed how you \_\_\_\_\_ when you got stuck. Nice problem solving!

Good Food Store provides 3% back to schools AND it's easier than ever! When checking out, just tell the Good Food Store cashier you want to donate to Lewis & Clark or give them our school "prefix" code of 334. They will send 3% of your purchase to L&C.

**TRY THE BOX TOP APP:** please consider installing the Box Top app on your smartphone. After you install the app and enter the school info, it is a simple process. Scan your receipt within 14 days and Box Top money is sent to the school!
