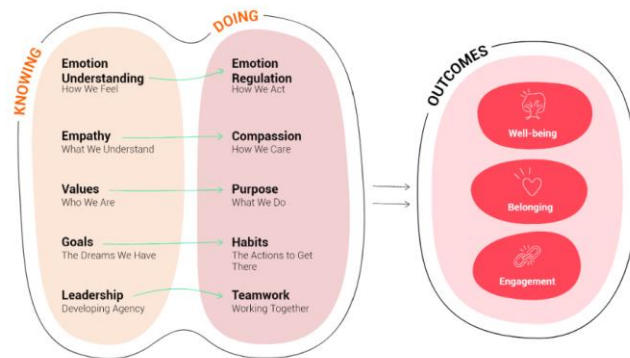

WMS Robotics

The WMS Robotics Team wrapped up an amazing season in style at the First Lego League World Festival in Houston in April. In addition to making some special connections with teams from Mexico and New Zealand, the team won a Core Values Finalist award! It's amazing to be coming home with a trophy after competing with the top 108 teams from around the world! There are over 30,000 teams who compete in First Lego League worldwide.

Core Values are one of the four judged/scored categories of the competition. Winning this award means that the team demonstrated the core values of the program consistently throughout all aspects of their work this season and during their participation at the competition. This is a reflection of their genuine care and support for one another as teammates, their kindness and positive interactions with other teams, and their consistent dedication to both the outcomes and the process of their work throughout the season. We can all be very proud of the way they represented WMS on the world stage.

If your student is interested in applying to be on the team next year, please encourage them to attend a short informational meeting in Mr. Arntzen's room after school on Monday, May 15th. In addition to helping students understand what First Lego League is, Mr. Arntzen will give some suggestions for things students can do over the summer that will help them be ready to write a great application in the fall. A few guidelines for book swap donations:

Books eligible for the WMS Library Book Swap must:

- Be in reasonably good condition. No large marks or tears, no missing pages or covers.
- Be age-relevant for 9th grade and younger.
- No non-fiction or reference book sets, encyclopedias, dictionaries, thesaurus, magazines, etc.
- Have a publication date of no more than 5 years old if they are nonfiction. Fiction can be older.

Please note: Donated books left over from at the end of the swap will be taken to Book Exchange and local donation sites.
