### **December 1 was the FAFSA Priority Deadline for Montana Colleges.**

Montana colleges have set December 1st as the FAFSA priority deadline. Students should complete their FAFSA to maximize aid eligibility. Montana colleges will start sending Financial Aid award letters.

## **2nd Semester Schedules**

If your student is not scheduled for a class period during 2nd semester, December is a great time to make a plan. Students are encouraged to stop into Counseling during lunch (students can tell yellow-line attendants that they need to make a 2nd semester schedule change) or 10 minute break to add classes. If a longer conversation is necessary, students can complete a Counselor Appointment Request form found in the hallway outside the Counseling Center.

## **2nd Semester MTDA Original Credit Classes**

Enrollment is open for MTDA Original Credit classes. If your student is interested in taking an on-line class, please view the course list and descriptions at: <http://montanadigitalacademy.org/resources/course-catalog/> Students can stop by Counseling to pick up the paperwork before school, after school or during lunch (students can tell yellow-line attendants that they need MTDA paperwork).

## **College Application Deadlines/Common Application Questions?**

The Common Application (CommonApp) requires your school counselor to submit the School Report Form and often a recommendation. You must submit your school counselor's email correctly into the Common App form. After submission, it is your responsibility to make sure your counselor has received the request. In addition to the School Report, your counselor can write you a comprehensive recommendation letter if you provide a **resume** immediately after the LOR request (Counselor Report). This should happen as early as possible, but no less than *two*



Tutors will be available through the Hellgate Flagship program until December 12th, meeting on Tues and Wed after school. Tutoring will resume on Tuesdays starting on January 15th.

**Looking Forward, Planning Ahead**

At the beginning of February our Course Request process for the 2018-2019 School Year will begin. An evening parent meeting will be held by Principal Miller, followed by a large group grade level presentation for students. They will then choose their courses the following week.

We encourage you to have conversations with your students now about how classes are currently going and what courses may be beneficial for your student moving forward to help them achieve their goals for the future.

**Junior Timeline**

During the month of December, Junior Counselors, Ben Martin and Jessica Buboltz, will pass out the HHS Junior Timeline in 11th grade Social Studies classes. This timeline will help students to prepare for Senior year and life after high school. When we pass out this information, it will also include a link to the Life After High School Planning Guide. The second half of Junior year is a great time to review this guide and start preparing for Senior year.
