We create our master schedule around these requests, and we ask students to select their requests based on the classes they want to take next year. We encourage you to review the information that they receive; we believe this is an excellent time to start having conversations about choices for the future.

Semester 2 Drop/Add Requests Jan 29-Feb 1

All HHS students have the first 4 days of classes of the 2nd semester to change their schedule without penalty. After this period, students have the option to drop a class with an F. Juniors and Seniors have until February 8 to drop a class (without penalty) for a study hall.

If a student would like to request a change, we are asking them to complete a Yellow Course Drop/Add Request form and attend the classes that are currently on their schedule. Counselors will process these requests in the order they are received. Students will either receive an updated schedule or a pass to see their Counselor.

Office Hours

Changes will be made to Freshmen and Sophomore schedules. Some students may be removed or added to a mandatory Office Hours teacher. Stay tuned for more info.

Office Hours is an opportunity for all students to check their Q account, work on make-up work or tests, and to have opportunities to check in with teachers about missed assignments. Please encourage your student to utilize office hours every Wednesday, even if they are not assigned to a teacher.

2019-2020 Course Requests February-March 2018

On January 30th, Parents and Students are invited to attend an Open House which will provide information on Course Requests for the 2019-20 school year. Department representatives will be present to discuss specific course offerings.

During the month of February, the HHS Counselors will present Course Request process to current 9th-11th grade students. We will discuss the importance of choosing classes for the 2019-20 school year and explain that the Master Schedule will be built based on courses that students choose through the Course Request process.

At each assembly, students will receive a Course Request Worksheet, MCPS Graduation Requirements and a list of potential courses available for the 2019-20 school year. We will ask students to bring the paperwork home, complete the course request worksheet, get a parent signature and add their course requests on to Q. Counselors will meet with the students the following week after their presentation (students must bring the course request worksheet to class) to review and collect their course requests worksheets and also review previously submitted online Q course requests. If your student misses school on the Wednesday of their class presentation, they can pick up the Course Request paperwork from the Counseling office and review the powerpoint online.

Please take the time to review your students' requests. Once schedules are released, changes will only be made for sound educational purposes, academic misplacements and elective changes for alternates that were previously chosen. See below for the tentative schedule:
