Thank you for the work you are doing to keep our schools and Missoula community safe.

I am writing as the mother of two MCPS students and as a contract teacher (through the Montana Natural History Center and SPARK! Arts) in MCPS schools.

I am strongly in support of requiring masks for all students, staff, and visitors. Ventilation and vaccination are equally important. However, MCPS has no control over which families and individuals choose to vaccinate. And, of course, our younger students do not even have that option yet.

My children homeschooled from March 2020- May 2021. They are loving being part of the in-person school community again. That would not be an option for our family without universal masking. Please help us continue to have our kids at school.

The plan for the first 6-weeks of school has allowed teachers to remove their mask in the classroom during instruction. My two kids feel unsafe when teachers who chose to remove their mask. Removing masks also fails to model the behavior we are asking of students. And, in many cases, it is likely our least cautious teachers who choose to remove their masks.

I ask that teachers stay masked in all indoor classroom settings.

One study, conducted in Arizona, where children returned to school in July, found that schools that did not require staff and students to wear masks were 3.5 times as likely to have a virus outbreak as schools that required universal masking.

A second study looked at infections among all children in 520 different counties across the United States, and found that once the public school year started, pediatric cases increased at a far higher rate in counties where schools did not require masks.

Dear Public School Decision Makers:

Thanks for your work to keep Missoula's children educated during these challenging time. My seven year old, like many young children has not been able to attend school as much as she or I would like and feel is in her best interest during the pandemic. I believe that requiring face coverings and other mitigation efforts have been key in allowing her the valuable opportunities she has had to attend school in person.

We were recently notified by her school that she was a "close contact" of someone with COVID earlier this week and are in the midst of canceling a week of work and family activities to accommodate the request that she stay home. In talking with her about possible exposures I have been shocked to learn how many different individuals she is exposed to during her school day. I am very glad that at least most of those potential exposures were where both she and the other individual were wearing a face covering. I would be very reluctant to send her back to school if less mitigation strategies were in place, especially given how dire the situation is with healthcare staffing right now in our hospitals

# Dear MCPS Trustee:

First and foremost, I want to thank you for your service and your dedication to make sound and data-based decisions for the safety and wellbeing of our community's students and staff. This past year has been excruciating and your service to our community should not be overlooked. I am writing today simply to thank you for your service, and to also support your work in making data-based decisions that will allow schools to continue to stay open.

We've learned that across the country many school board members are being threatened, harrassed, bullied, and mobbed by protesters, loudly threatening trustees to cast votes to "unmask our children" in the name of "freedom." I do not personally see how a cloth mask has become some statement of freedom or not, but I also recognize that sadly this pandemic has brought out the worst in many. As a parent of MCPS students, a community member, a voter, a taxpayer, I want to lend my support in elected officials' decisions that are science-based and data driven- also with the caution that should be employed at times when we don't have all the answers- we don't yet know what we don't yet know- especially with an evolving virus. What I do know is that my children want to be in school, and I support measures that allow schools to stay open for students and staff, safely. I urge a taskforce to make decisions based on caution, knowing that sound scientific findings take time, and therefore guidance must often often change with time and data maturity. Stay diligent, stay the course, act with logic, compassion, caution, and a scientific mind. Across the country we are seeing real-time that schools that do not require children to wear masks are experiencing massive covid outbreaks, resulting in more disease spread, overwhelmed hospitals, and mass guarantines/school closures- do we really want OUR children to be the guinea pigs, and do I want my children's school to close? Personally, I do not.

My children and I are completely thrilled that school buildings are open-children can learn amongst their friends and teachers, in the most normal way possible right now. I'm also sure you are aware of the growing mental health crisis among youth in the Missoula valley. It is already documented that MCPS student mental health was negatively affected last year. Our school aged kids are several times more likely to die by suicide than by Covid. Why then are we taking precautions only for the spread of Covid, when suicide takes more of our kids lives?





On July 8th, the preliminary conclusions for a multicenter academic study in Britain were released and submitted for publication. That 12 month study found that in the entire population of youth in Britain ages 0-17, the number of deaths attributed solely to Covid-19 was 25. This was a large pediatric study having a population size of over 12 million children. The mortality rate was 1 death per 481,000 children, or .00021%. Britain had no vaccine that had received approval to treat children under 18 at the time.

On July 11th, the CDC released the conclusions of a study in which 335 children aged 0-17 died from Covid-19 in the United States. The US population in that age category is estimated to be 73.4 million as of 2020. The CDC study does not separate the healthy and co-morbid population as the British study did. The CDC did not perform this analysis, and the reported mortality is for the combined group for an extended period of 18 months. Clinical data demonstrated that for all US children ages 0-17, the mortality rate was 1 death per 219,000, or .00046%.

On July 19th, John's Hopkins University and Medical Center released their study for the same 0-17 age category. This population size was considerably smaller at 48,000, but it showed ZERO deaths over a 16 month period.

All three studies show similar results. The evidence is conclusive that any upturn in Covid-19 mortality was not associated with this 0-17 age group, but with older population groups.

On July 27th, the CDC issued their new guidelines recommending that students wear masks for the 2021-2022 school year. This flies directly in the face of the previous three studies (and many others not cited here that can be easily found in an online search) even though they represented the most recent data published on the 0-17 age population. The information used to form this recommendation hasn't been seen or published, according to the CDC itself. Therefore, this recommendation must be considered without merit and points to no identifiable clinical information or study that would support its decision.

There continues to be growing cumulative evidence that the use of masks in children and infants pose a severe threat to their physical and psychological health, also questioning the functional deterrence of masks against the Covid-19 virus.

The right to choose whether a child is vaccinated or wears a mask in class is a Parental decision, not the School Board's. Any decision by the MCPSBT that is in direct opposition to the studies above (and again, the countless others out there that can even be found directly on the CDC website) is baseless and clinically unsubstantiated. The most recent objective clinical conclusions should and must be considered when deciding upon mandates and prevention measures in the schools. Any continued use of masks for the 0-17 age population has no clinical foundation, and also places children in significant danger from emotional and psychological trauma. Any considerations other than the health, safety, and quality of education for children under the age of 18 is outside the realm of the school board's jurisdiction and concern.

I have also included a form that gives details from the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act regarding Emergency Use Authorization, specifically applied to masks. I have copy and pasted it below, as I believe it to be directly relevant and crucial information regarding the board's Covid prevention methods:

NOTICE FOR EMPLOYERS, UNIVERSITIES AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS MANDATING COVID-19 MASKS

# **Revised 6/4/21**

This serves as notice that the mandate for any individual to wear a mask against COVID-19 for employment or attendance at a university or other institution violates federal law. All COVID-19 masks, whether surgical, N95 or other respirators, are authorized, not approved or licensed, by the federal government; they are Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) only. They merely "may be effective." Federal law states:

Title 21 U.S.C. § 360bbb-3(e)(1)(A)(ii)(I-III) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (FD&C Act) states:

individuals to whom the product is administered are informed-

that the Secretary has authorized the emergency use of the product;

of the significant known and potential benefits and risks of such use, and of the extent to which such benefits and risks are unknown; and

of the option to accept or refuse administration of the product, of the consequences, if any, of refusing administration of the product, and of the alternatives to the product that are available and of their benefits and risks.

EUA products are by definition experimental and thus require the right to refuse. Under the Nuremberg Code, the foundation of ethical medicine, no one may be coerced to participate in a medical experiment. Consent of the individual is "absolutely essential." A federal court held that even the U.S. military could not mandate EUA vaccines to soldiers. Doe #1 v. Rumsfeld, 297 F.Supp.2d 119 (2003).

In a letter dated April 24, 2020, the Food and Drug Administration stated that authorized face masks must be labelled accurately and may not be labeled in a way that misrepresents the product's intended use as "source control to help prevent the spread of SARS-CoV-2." The letter specifies that the labeling "may not state or imply that the product is intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection or related uses or is for use such as infection prevention or reduction." Any EUA mandate requiring individuals to wear face masks conflicts with Section 360bbb-3(e)(1)(A)(ii)(I-III), which provides that the person must be informed of the option to refuse to wear the device.

Liability for forced participation in a medical experiment, including possible injury, may be incalculable. Children's Health Defense urges U.S. employers, universities and other institutions to respect and uphold the rights of individuals to refuse to wear EUA masks.

I am a local ER doctor and I have intimate knowledge of the strain on our health care resources during this current COVID-19 surge. Our hospital floors and ICUs are overcapacity with patients, and staff is stretched between more patients than they should be. Two nights ago we were in a situation where we had to decide who did and who didn't receive the last ventilator in the hospital and we are teetering on using crisis standards to triage care for dying patients. For over a month, I have had to make many tragically tough decisions to refuse transfer to Missoula of seriously ill patients with time-sensitive conditions, in effect, leaving them to potentially expire at smaller hospitals.

We have mounting evidence that school masking is a valuable tool to prevent spread of disease to vulnerable populations, even from data as near to home as Gallatin County.

Under these current crisis circumstances, it is our duty to our students, teachers, and public-at-large to continue to enforce a mask mandate to avoid preventable deaths.

As promised, here is the statement I delivered to the board this evening, followed by a list of supporters.

My name is Jill Taber. I'm delivering this statement on behalf of 33 Missoula parents. I will send this statement and their names to the public comment email after the meeting tonight.

MCPS does not have a COVID crisis.

MCPS has a respect crisis.

MCPS has a confidence crisis.

MCPS has a control crisis.

The Missoula County Health Department's data shows ZERO deaths for the 0-19 year-old age group — a 100% survival rate. Across all age groups, the survival rate is just over 99 percent.

The county cannot impose a mask mandate and even when it could, masking did nothing to curb spread.

MCPS continues to refuse to RESPECT the rights of families to make their own choices regarding face coverings. MCPS continues to disregard the CONFIDENCE of parents in their constitutionally-protected rights to make health care decisions for their children.

Yesterday afternoon, the task force seemed to agree that a benchmark for removing the mask mandate should be set. Thank you. But the task force and the administration is in no rush to set a number, stating they need time to assess.

The district wants to buy time to placate parents who want a benchmark until they can admit the truth out loud: the benchmark is ZERO. The district will only tolerate ZERO COVID cases as the metric for allowing parental choice regarding masks. MCPS will not release its grip on mitigation strategies. The can will be kicked down the road until vaccinations can be coerced or forced.

This circular, non-sensical, CONTROL-oriented thinking needs to stop. How much time is wasted discussing contact tracing, percentage of staff and students on "quarantine", and the difference between a 7-day average of 15 new cases versus 20 new cases?

When will we, as a community and as a school district, admit that COVID is here to stay? When will the fearmongering cease? When will the district consider the most important data point of all: a county-wide survival rate of over 99 percent? When will we stop wringing our hands over CASE COUNTS? We will continue to voice opposition to these hypocritical mandates and mitigation strategies as long as these facts and questions go unvoiced, unasked, and unanswered by anyone involved in the recommendation or decision-making process.

The MCPS face covering policy does not need to be a zero-sum game. MCPS, restore your confidence in Missoula families.

The MCPS tagline is "Forward Thinking, High Achieving." It's a shame that inspired motto has been replaced by fearbased, control-seeking decision making that divides our community, disregards facts and data, and hurts our students - the very ones this district is meant to champion.
