Superintendent Watson, members of the board of trustees, fellow parents and community members:

Nearly 500 days ago, then-Governor Steve Bullock ordered Montana schools to close due to the coronavirus pandemic.

In the course of those 500 days, our school children have borne burdens they should NEVER have been expected to shoulder. I have watched my son's excitement for school plummet due to school closures, mask requirements, social distancing, and an absolute assault on kids' abilities to learn, socialize, and grow in a school environment.

I'm beyond tired. There's no rhyme, reason, or SCIENCE to support a continued mask requirement in our schools. In 500 days, we've learned that COVID is NOT a pediatric disease (a physician friend told me this even BEFORE the pandemic), that serious cases among children are extremely rare, and that kids are NOT spreading the disease.

It didn't take a pandemic for me to know that my husband and I know what is best for our children and our family. In 500 days, EVERY family within MCPS has chosen how to best deal with COVID.

NO MASKS for 2021-2022 at MCPS. Enough is enough. If the district requires elementary age children to wear masks, telling them their presence is not welcome -- DANGEROUS -- unless they cover their face, we risk a horrendous and continued assault on their confidence as human beings. Further mask mandates for our children will further cripple their passions and abilities for learning, socializing, and maturing into young adults who can think for themselves.

I beg of you: don't require masks for ANY kids at MCPS, K-12, for 2021-2022.

## Make masks optional for elementary children please

#### Dear Board of Trustees,

I am writing today on behalf of the emotional, social and mental health of our youngest Missoula students which has been pushed aside throughout the pandemic. Not one day did I argue against masks last year, in fact I still wear my mask while at work as an ER nurse for my 12 hour shifts without complaint. Not one day did my daughter argue about her mask last year, but now that vaccines have been made available to all of our wonderful teachers, staff, and at-risk caretakers of our students, I am begging that we make masks optional for the 2021-2022 school year. Last year was an unprecedented year, and I'm so glad we all made it through and are stronger for it. We have more information going into this year, and we need to utilize all of that info going forward. We need to stop the virtue signaling and begin to look at the data, as we did when we successfully moved out of the hybrid model and into full time instruction. There are plenty of states and countries that had full time school without masks, let's please draw from that data moving forward. Kids are NOT spreading the virus, regardless of masks. It's time to put their delicate and developing mental, social, and emotional health first.

Influenza kills elementary aged students at the same rate that COVID does, we have never mandated mask wearing for influenza. Although we don't have the current year's suicide data, we do know that on average suicide kills around 8,000 children yearly, where influenza kills around 200 (1). Assuming what we know about influenza and COVID death rates in children being very similar we can assume that suicide will massively outpace COVID once we get that official count next year. Yet we aren't linking the necessary emotional component of seeing other faces, enjoying the smile from a classmate or the reassuring facial expression from a teacher on a job well done. We are social beings, we NEED to see facial expressions for that emotional health. Suicide is far greater of a threat to our children and we need to treat it that way. Young elementary children NEED to see their teachers mouths moving to learn to read, write, and speak correctly. The teachers NEED to see their students' mouths moving to correct their speech. Despite mask mandates in schools last year, every single teacher and student will attest to pulling their mask down frequently during every single school day, which negates the purpose of masking. Speech and language specialists are already seeing the effects of masking young children in preschools and elementary schools. Teachers report the numerous stresses on themselves in trying to teach while also keeping masks on, and constantly nagging students to do the same over and over.

My question is "why"? Please have the decency and respect to give me and other inquiring minds the reasoning behind why we might keep masks this next school year. We are educated, smart, rational decision making adults who just want to know the reasoning and the data behind the choice. We pay taxes to use this public service and we need to be included in the decision making process that affects our children. No one loves our children more than we do as their parents, we will do whatever we need to keep them safe. That being said, their emotional, mental and social health is more at risk here than their physical health, and I am begging you to keep that in mind. Where do we need to put our focus and energy this next year? Enforcing useless mask requirements is not one of them.

The MOA is available, thankfully, for the families that choose to use it. Let's dig through some real data and come to a conclusion based on science, NOT on fear and emotional reactions. We've made the "tough" decision in going back full time and \*YAY\* it worked. No one died, our local COVID numbers continued on their downward trend following that decision, everyone was much better off for returning 5 days a week, and I thank you sincerely for making that decision. Time to look at the data again and make the tough and correct decision to make masking optional in schools this next year.

I'm writing to inquire if masks will be required of students, staff, and teachers for Fall 2021 until all students have been given ample and easy access to be vaccinated? We are now approximately one month out from when teachers and staff will return to school to prep for the new year, and approximately 6 weeks from the start of the new school year.

As you know, a new, more highly contagious COVID variant is now the dominant strain in the United States, and our state vaccination rate for eligible individuals is not leading to optimistic expectations for how this variant will hit our population.

"The country, which just celebrated the Fourth of July with some of its first large gatherings in more than a year, is headed toward a "dangerous" fall season when delta is expected to cause another surge in new coronavirus cases, health experts say. Hello,

Last night I started a petition for school boards to implement mask mandates in schools, and for Governor Gianforte to allow school districts to maintain the local control to do so. I plan to collect signatures through August 9, but because I understand some meetings on the subject are happening earlier, I wanted to give you a heads up that we have collected 217 responses in 24 hours so far. The text of the petition can be found below. I am happy to provide preliminary signatures upon request.

The signers of this petition support mask mandates in Montana public schools for the Fall 2021 semester. They ask the MT state government to allow school districts the freedom to enact such mandates in accordance with the most recent guidance from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Center for Disease Control.

AAP Guidance, July 19, 2021: "Everything possible must be done to keep students in schools in-person...All students older than 2 years and all school staff should wear face masks at school (unless medical or developmental conditions prohibit use). The AAP recommends universal masking in school at this time for the following reasons:

- -a significant portion of the student population is not eligible for vaccination
- -protection of unvaccinated students from COVID-19 and to reduce transmission
- -lack of a system to monitor vaccine status among students, teachers and staff
- -potential difficulty in monitoring or enforcing mask policies for those who are not vaccinated; in the absence of schools being able to conduct this monitoring, universal masking is the best and most effective strategy to create consisent messages, expectations, enforcement, and compliance without the added burden of needing to monitor vaccination status
- -possibility of low vaccination uptake within the surrounding school community
- -continued concerns for variants that are more easily spread among children, adolescents, and adults"

CDC Guidance, July 27, 2021: "Given new evidence on the B.1.617.2 (Delta) variant, CDC has updated the guidance for fully vaccinated people. CDC recommends universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status. Children should return to full-time in-person learning in the fall with layered prevention strategies in place."

RE: Mask mandate for healthy school children

First, I would like to cite a German study, Randomized Clinical Trial published in the Journal of the American Medical Association:

Walach H, Weikl R, Prentice J, et al. Experimental Assessment of Carbon Dioxide Content in Inhaled Air With or Without Face Masks in Healthy Children: A Randomized Clinical Trial. JAMA Pediatrics. Published online June 30, 2021. doi:10.1001/jamapediatrics.2021.2659

- Healthy CO2 blood content should be 0.04% by volume
- Masked children had almost 10 X more CO2 0.39%
- Masks increase CO2 in bloodstream to nearly twice allowable level in a closed room.
- Younger children effected the most

Effects of high CO2 in bloodstream (Hypercapnia):

- o Drowsiness.
- o Skin that looks flushed.
- o Trouble concentrating or thinking clearly.
- o Dizziness or disorientation.
- o Shortness of breath.
- o Hyperventilation.
- o Feeling tired.
- o Changes in the color of the skin.

Symptoms of CO2 overexposure by inhalation include dizziness, headache, nausea, rapid breathing, shortness of breath, deeper breathing, increased heart rate (tachycardia), eye and extremity twitching, cardiac arrhythmia, memory disturbances, lack of concentration, visual and hearing disturbances (including photophobia, ...

Some of us don't trust the guidance from CDC and American Pediatrics, its within our rights to challenge their recommendations.

I would like to remind Missoula County that state law forbids students being removed from school property for not wearing a mask. HB 501 1.4

This does not however prevent administrators, staff, and teachers from taking other punitive actions against my children, through shaming, humiliation, or removal from class. This deeply concerns me as I will not send my children to learn in a hostile environment.

Additionally, the efforts to mandate masking of students appears COERCIVE to influence Parent and Student decisions regarding EXPERIMENTAL vaccines. My daughter was told by her Vice Principal that mask mandates will be in place until 70% of students have been vaccinated. Since the vaccines are experimental, and coercive masking mandates have caused MENTAL SUFFERING and possible physical injury to my children, I believe the following code applies to

all county employees, school board members, school administrators, staff, and teachers involved in the implementation of mask mandates:

## The Nuremberg Code (1947)

### Permissible Medical Experiments

The great weight of the evidence before us to effect that certain types of medical experiments on human beings, when kept within reasonably well-defined bounds, conform to the ethics of the medical profession generally. The protagonists of the practice of human experimentation justify their views on the basis that such experiments yield results for the good of society that are unprocurable by other methods or means of study. All agree, however, that certain basic principles must be observed in order to satisfy moral, ethical and legal concepts:

1. The voluntary consent of the human subject is absolutely essential. This means that the person involved should have legal capacity to give consent; should be so situated as to be able to exercise free power of choice, WITHOUT THE INTERVENTION OF ANY ELEMENT OF FORCE, FRAUD, DECEIT, DURESS, OVERREACHING, OR OTHER ULTERIOR FORM OF CONSTRAINT OR COERCION; and should have sufficient knowledge and comprehension of the elements of the subject matter involved as to enable him to make an understanding and enlightened decision. This latter element requires that before the acceptance of an affirmative decision by the experimental subject there should be made known to him the nature, duration, and purpose of the experiment; the method and means by which it is to be conducted; all inconveniences and hazards reasonably to be expected; and the effects upon his health or person which may possibly come from his participation in the experiment.

The duty and responsibility for ascertaining the quality of the consent rests upon each individual who initiates, directs, or engages in the experiment. It is a personal duty and responsibility which may not be delegated to another with impunity.

- 2. The experiment should be such as to yield fruitful results for the good of society, unprocurable by other methods or means of study, and not random and unnecessary in nature.
- 3. The experiment should be so designed and based on the results of animal experimentation and a knowledge of the natural history of the disease or other problem under study that the anticipated results justify the performance of the experiment.
- 4. The experiment should be so conducted as to avoid all unnecessary physical and mental suffering and injury.
- 5. No experiment should be conducted where there is an a priori reason to believe that death or disabling injury will occur; except, perhaps, in those experiments where the experimental physicians also serve as subjects.
- 6. The degree of risk to be taken should never exceed that determined by the humanitarian importance of the problem to be solved by the experiment.

- 7. Proper preparations should be made and adequate facilities provided to protect the experimental subject against even remote possibilities of injury, disability or death.
- 8. The experiment should be conducted only by scientifically qualified persons. The highest degree of skill and care should be required through all stages of the experiment of those who conduct or engage in the experiment.
- 9. During the course of the experiment the human subject should be at liberty to bring the experiment to an end if he has reached the physical or mental state where continuation of the experiment seems to him to be impossible.
- 10. During the course of the experiment the scientist in charge must be prepared to terminate the experiment at any stage, if he has probable cause to believe, in the exercise of the good faith, superior skill and careful judgment required of him, that a continuation of the experiment is likely to result in injury, disability, or death to the experimental subject.

Hello. My family has three kids that possibly will be starting 3rd grade at Chief Charlo this coming school year. As far as a normal start to school for children mine have only been through kindergarten where there was not an extra concern from the normal viruses of becoming sick. Now the main lesson my children are learning everyday at school is wear a mask, stay away from your friends, wash hands excessively throughout the day with mostly hand sanitizer and not even soap and water, few minutes to eat with no mask, to then put back on the mask to go outside and again being reminded to stay apart from all other children. These are far from the values my wife and I would ever instill in our children. Compassion for other people is not built on distance.

It's understandable that we had a noval virus that has consumed the world and only with time would we be able to understand its impact on our community and kids. For more than a year and a half we have learned that children have not been affected nearly the same as the elderly. They have not been a source of spreading and illness has been notably less than for people over the age of 55. The CDC shows that for school aged kids 4-18 have had a little more than 400 kids die from covid19. However the CDC also says that from the deaths only on average 5% of those deaths are from covid alone and the rest had other comorbidities, usually multiple. That means that possibly 20 kids from 4-18 years old may have died of covid alone in the United States. Of course we all know that there are absolutely no deaths from flu for any age group in the United States. In a normal flu season for kids ages 4-18 there are on average 150 to 200 deaths a season which is measured by 12 months and from this pandemic our total deaths are measured closer to 18 months. Also note again the possible deaths of children by covid alone (20) and those with comorbidities (380). Again this is not to be exact or fully up to date as I haven't checked the CDC sight as of today. Finally from the CDC's numbers they show more kids have drowned in 2020 than died from covid. So to save more children's lives we should put them in life preservers everyday rather than putting them in masks.

The science on masks has been back and forth and you can find any study to help your argument. Masks are proven however to cause children and adults to breathe less oxygen and more carbon dioxide. I use a cgi, or combustible gas indicator, for my job and when using it under a mask within seconds it will alarm as an oxygen insufficient area. Per OSHA if that was a confined space I would need a SCBA to enter.

My wife and I strongly support children not to be mandated at school to wear a mask to attend. We also strongly support that parents should have the right to choose for their child on what they think is best and not the school choosing for them. The CDC's credibility has been deteriorating rapidly as of late.

As I mentioned in the opening paragraph my children possibly would be going to a public school however if masks are mandated at all they will not be enrolled in a public school. This is a great opportunity for schools and teachers to start again teaching our kids in a more loving environment that supports the mental and emotional growth kids require. The solution to this virus should not be more damaging to our youth than the virus itself.

To the Mr. Watson, members of the MCPS Covid Task Force, and members of the School Board,

I am writing to respectfully request that masks be mandated for public school for the 2021/2022 school year, at least until vaccinations have been made available and children under the age of 12 have had a reasonable chance to be vaccinated, which I am hoping will happen by the spring semester of 2022.

I am one of the many parents who enrolled my children in the Missoula Online Academy last year. That decision was based on several factors—the desire to help "flatten the curve," to prevent my children from getting sick and carrying COVID-19 back to at risk members of my household and close family, and as more details emerged about the disease and its potential outcomes, to prevent my children from getting sick themselves and risking life threatening complications and/or long-hauler covid symptoms.

I was grateful for the option to enroll them in MOA and for the dedication and hard work of their teachers to keep them engaged and on track with their academics—but make no mistake—it was not the easy option, and it definitely had an impact on their mental and emotional well being, their physical health, and on their academic performance. They are both currently enrolled to return to in-person instruction this fall, with one major caveat—we have been waiting for MCPS's decisions on mask wearing and covid prevention strategies. Neither of my children are old enough to be vaccinated yet, which would mitigate the risk somewhat, and until they can be vaccinated I am not comfortable sending them back to school without a mask-wearing mandate.

I was distressed to learn that at the first task force meeting, multiple parents showed up to protest mask wearing and made health claims such as "masks increase carbon dioxide levels," that "masks don't work," that "kids don't die and it's no worse than the flu."

The simple fact of the matter is that these claims aren't true. Children do die and many have long hauler symptoms. And the claims about carbon dioxide and masks not working have been disproven by multiple scientific studies, by simple real world examples from people who have worn masks and run races or done other highly strenuous activities, and by medical personnel who have worn masks for hours on end to tend to people sick with Covid-19 and other highly communicable diseases. Saying otherwise is ignorant or deliberately ignoring science, and refusing to wear a mask when it can protect yourself and others is simply selfish.

Both the Center for Disease Control and the American Academy of Pediatrics are recommending that masks be worn in school, regardless of vaccination status. The Delta variant is proving to be both more contagious and more virulent than previous strains. And the fact remains that we still don't know what the long-term effects of Covid-19 really involve or how long they will last. One study (see link below) that came out in June estimates that as many as 24% of people who survive Covid-19—even non-hospitalized patients with "mild" symptoms or asymptomatic cases—suffer long-term symptoms after their "recovery." And as a parent, I will do everything in my power to prevent my kids from suffering from a eminently preventable outcome.

Please do not send students back to the classroom this fall unmasked and unprotected from the SARS-Cov-2 virus that is still very much raging across the country and around the globe. It is not yet safe for unvaccinated populations to gather in any sort of enclosed space.

This has become a very controversial, touchy, heated topic for various reasons. Parents rightfully want their children to be safe. People have gotten wrong ideas about what that means, Please, look at the science, Listen to the career virologists. Look at the recommendations that have come from those whose job it is to know how to keep the population safe. The Center for Disease Control, CDC, again now recommends masking up while indoors as they again see case numbers climbing. The American Academy of Pediatrics, APA, is recommending students wear masks in the classroom. In every country that has been able to fight back this virus, it is because they have taken precautions to prevent the spread. Doing nothing, keeping business as usual, has not stopped the spread. It has only gotten worse when it is ignored.

I know the arguments against masks. Frankly speaking, they are all wrong.

"Masks increase CO2 levels in the body."

No, they do not. There is exactly zero evidence available that a proper cloth mask, a surgical mask, a KN95 mask, an N95 mask or any of the other appropriate masks do anything of the sort. People from all walks of life have been wearing protective masks and respirators for decades with no ill effects. A mask designed to contain the spread of Covid does not increase CO2 levels in the body. It does not block O2 from entering the body. It does not restrict breathing in any meaningful way.

"Masks do not work to prevent the spread."

Yes, they do. Covid is spread by the moisture that leaves the body's respiratory system. It is projected into the room when someone coughs, sneezes, belches, hiccoughs or even simply breathes. A proper mask properly covering the nose and mouth will capture that spray and reduce the viral load spreading into the room. Less viral load in the room means less chance of the virus spreading.

"Covid is no worse than the flu."

Yes, it is. It has been 100 years since "the flu" brought the country to its knees. Covid is worse than the flu. The mortality rate of covid is orders of magnitude higher than the flu. The flu doesn't require refrigerated morgue trucks be set up to contain corpses. The flu doesn't deplete an entire hospital system's supply of oxygen just trying to keep patients alive. The flu doesn't call retired nurses, physicians, respiratory specialists out of retirement to help keep people alive. Covid is worse than the flu.

"Children don't die of covid."

Yes, they do. Hospitals have been reluctant to report it but the numbers are climbing. Children are on ventilators. Children are dying from this virus. Is the number high? Not yet. If we continue to do nothing to protect the vulnerable, that number will continue to rise. Pack children into a school with no protection and we will see many parents' nightmare manifest.

What no one seems to mention is the horror of long covid in children. A grade schooler who has their lungs destroyed by this preventable virus will forever be unable to participate in playground games. Brain fog will wreck their academic aptitude. Loss of taste and smell will make living life just that much more difficult. Even if a kid contracts this thing and doesn't die, what are the long term ramifications of catching it? They'll be living with that for the rest of their lives. Wearing masks to prevent the spread significantly reduces the chance that they will be disabled through no fault of their own.

"Wearing a mask is a gag."

That's preposterous.

"Wearing a mask is government overreach and will lead to authoritarian control."

The government has the power and responsibility to implement what is appropriate to protect the population from harm. This isn't new. If wearing masks will prevent the spread (see above, it will) that is the easiest way to stop this thing until vaccines are available to children.



Hi Mr. Watson,

I am writing to provide public comment to the Covid Task Force convening August 3.

I strenuously urge the Task Force to continue to follow the best available public health recommendations made by the CDC, the local MCCHD, the AAP, and other respected entities in making public health decisions for the Missoula County Public Schools, based on local conditions. At this time, this means starting the school year requiring masks be worn by everyone in the building.

My daughter will be a 2nd grader at Chief Charlo Elementary, and my husband is a teacher at Willard. Both were in inperson school last year. That decision, though difficult, was made easier by the numerous precautions taken by MCPS to ensure the safety of students, faculty, and staff.

Neither my husband nor daughter found masks to be difficult or unduly uncomfortable to wear. In fact, masks enabled, they did not inhibit, learning. Since teachers and learners felt safer, the learning environment worked better. My daughter learned and saw that as members of a school community, we do things to take care of each other and keep each other safe. As the community opened up, we felt safer visiting Grandma, knowing that both our school-exposed family members had at least been protected by the fact that everyone in their schools wore masks (I was exposed to far fewer people in my job, but we were masked as well).

Further, science has continued to demonstrate that masks are one of the most effective preventative measures available to us besides, of course, vaccines. Until significantly more people are vaccinated, and so long as the Delta variant continues to increase numbers in our community, the safe decision for Missoula schools is to start the school requiring masks of all individuals. Please demonstrate what we expect our kids to learn at MCPS - that some sources of information are more reliable than others, that expertise is developed through study, learning, testing, and science, and that sometimes we do things not just because it protects us, but also to protect the most vulnerable in our community, including kids who can't be vaccinated yet, elderly family members, other at-risk students and faculty and family members, etc. Please recommend that MCPS require masking by all students, staff, and faculty at MCPS, regardless of vaccination status, until conditions improve and merit a change to that policy.

Dear Covid Task Force,

I apologize I won't be able to attend your meeting tomorrow. Masks have been reliable in slowing the spread of COVID 19, including variants. Now that Delta is catchable AND TRANSMITTED by vaccinated people, it is important to take precautionary measures to keep our kids healthy, as well as our teachers, counselors, administrators and everyone else, Even if older kids are old enough to get vaccinated, many will still live with children who are not able to be vaccinated. Additionally, the Delta variant has drastically changed the equation. It means that if my child brings it home from school, I could get it and give it to my mom who is at high risk or he could give it to his step mom who is undergoing treatment for breast cancer or to his three siblings too young to be vaccinated. It also means that my high risk teenager, who opted for MOA last year and missed out on a Freshman year in order to stay safe will not be safe at school once again. Between him being vaccinated and having masks at school I feel safe sending him to in person school, where he needs to be. To Whom It May Concern:

I am sending you this notice, on behalf of Family or Child Name. My findings raise significant concerns, both medically and legally, of the current mask policy in place. Masks are ineffective for the purpose claimed by the mandate, potentially harmful, and only authorized for use by an EUA.

### Masks are ineffective and in many ways they harm.

It's a myth that masks prevent viruses from spreading. The overall evidence is clear: Standard cloth and surgical masks offer next to no protection against virus-sized particles or small aerosols. The size of a virus particle is much too small to be stopped by a surgical mask, cloth or bandana. A single virion of SARS-CoV-2 is about 60-140 nanometers or 0.1 microns. The pore size in a surgical mask is 200-1000x that size. Consider that the CDC website states, "surgical masks do not catch all harmful particles in smoke." And that the size of smoke particles in a wildfire are ~0.5 microns which is 5x the size of the SARS-CoV-2 virus! Wearing a mask to prevent catching SARS-CoV-2, or similarly sized influenza, is like throwing sand at a chain-link fence: it doesn't work. There has been one large randomized controlled trial that specifically examined whether masks protect their wearers from the coronavirus. This study found mask wearing "did not reduce, at conventional levels of statistical significance, the incidence of Sars-Cov-2-infection."

Consider also, that the existence of more particles does not mean more virus. Research shows less virus does not mean less illness. Dr. Kevin Fennelly, a pulmonologist at the National Heart, Lung and Blood institute debunked the view that larger droplets are responsible for viral transmission. Fennelly wrote:

"current infection control policies are based on the premise that most respiratory infections are transmitted by large respiratory droplets- i.e., larger than 5 [microns] – produced by coughing and sneezing, ... Unfortunately, that premise is wrong."

Fennelly referenced a 1953 paper on anthrax that showed a single bacterial spore of about one micron was significantly more lethal than larger clumps of spores.<sup>5</sup> Exposure to one virus particle is theoretically enough to cause infection and subsequent disease. This is not an alarming thought - it simply means what it has always meant, that our immune system protects us continually all our life.<sup>6</sup>

There have been hundreds of mask studies related to influenza transmission done over several decades. It is a well-established fact that masks do not stop viruses. "Part of that evidence shows that cloth facemasks actually increase influenza-linked illness." Bacteria are 50x larger than virus particles. As such, virus particles can enter through the mask pores, yet bacteria remain trapped inside of the mask, resulting in the mask-wearer continually exposed to the bacteria.

Related to the 1918-1919 influenza pandemic, there was almost universal agreement among experts, that deaths were virtually never caused by the influenza virus itself but resulted directly from severe secondary pneumonia caused by well-known bacterial "pneumopathogens" that colonized the upper respiratory tract.<sup>9</sup> Dr. Fauci and his National Institute of Health studied pandemics and epidemics and concluded, "the vast majority of influenza deaths resulted from secondary bacterial pneumonia." <sup>10</sup>

All parties mandating the use of facemasks are not only willfully ignoring established science but are engaging in what amounts to a whole school clinical experimental trial. This conclusion is reached by the fact that facemask use and COVID-19 incidence are being reported in scientific opinion pieces promoted by the CDC and others. The fact is after reviewing ALL of the studies worldwide, the CDC found "no reduction in viral transmission with the use of face masks."

Additionally, Children have been repeatedly shown not to be drivers of this contagion. It is well-accepted that children have a statistically zero chance of dying from COVID. The CDC shows the K-12 mortality rate from or with COVID is .00003. Any intervention, especially one that is prophylactic, must cause fewer harms to the recipient than the infection. Since children have the lowest death rate from COVID infection, the cost-benefit of requiring children to wear an investigational face-covering with emerging safety issues is especially difficult to justify. Anthony Fauci was very clear that asymptomatic transmission was not a threat. He stated, "in all the history of respiratory-borne viruses of any type, asymptomatic transmission has never been the driver of outbreaks. The driver of outbreaks is always a symptomatic person." <sup>14</sup>

Wearing respirators come(s) with a host of physiological and psychological burdens. These can interfere with task performances and reduce work efficiency. These burdens can even be severe enough to cause life-threatening conditions if not ameliorated.<sup>15</sup> Fifteen years ago, National Taiwan University Hospital concluded that the use of N-95 masks in healthcare workers caused them to experience hypoxemia, a low level of oxygen in the blood, and hypercapnia, an elevation in the blood's carbon dioxide levels.<sup>16</sup> Studies of simple surgical masks found significant reductions in blood oxygen as well. In one particular study, researchers measured blood oxygenation before and after surgeries in 53 surgeons. Researchers found the mask reduced the blood oxygen levels significantly, and the longer the duration of wearing the mask, the greater the drop in blood oxygen levels.<sup>17</sup>

Moreover, people with cancer, will be at a further risk from hypoxia, as cancer cells grow best in a bodily environment that is low in oxygen. Low oxygen also promotes systemic inflammation which, in turn, promotes "the growth, invasion and spread of cancers." Repeated episodes of low oxygen, known as intermittent hypoxia, also "causes atherosclerosis" and hence increases "all cardiovascular events" such as heart attacks, as well as adverse cerebral events like stroke. 19

Furthermore, the mandatory mouth mask in schools is a major threat to a child's development. It ignores the essential needs of a growing child. The well-being of children and young people is highly dependent on the emotional connection with others. Masks create a threatening and unsafe environment, where emotional connection becomes difficult.<sup>20</sup>


### Informed consent is required for investigational medical therapies.

Regardless of the lack of safety and efficacy behind the decision to require a child to wear a mask, it is illegal to mandate EUA approved investigational medical therapies without informed consent. Mask use for viral transmission prevention is authorized for Emergency Use only.<sup>21</sup> Emergency Use Authorization by the FDA, means "the products are investigational and experimental" only.<sup>22</sup> The statute granting the FDA the power to authorize a medical product of emergency use requires that the person being administered the unapproved product be advised of his or her right to refuse administration of the product.<sup>23</sup> This statute further recognizes the well-settled doctrine that medical experiments, or "clinical research," may not be performed on human subjects without the express, informed consent of the individual receiving treatment.<sup>24</sup>

The right to avoid the imposition of human experimentation is fundamental, rooted in the Nuremberg Code of 1947, has been ratified by the 1964 Declaration of Helsinki, and further codified in the United States Code of Federal Regulations. In addition to the Unites States regarding itself as bound by these provisions, these principles were adopted by the FDA in its regulations requiring the informed consent of human subjects for medical research.<sup>25</sup> Add State info here if possible. The law is very clear; It is unlawful to conduct medical research (even in the case of emergency), unless steps taken to ... secure informed consent of all participants.<sup>26</sup>

Furthermore, by requiring children to wear a mask, you are promoting the idea that the mask can prevent or treat a disease, which is an illegal deceptive practice. It is unlawful to advertise that a product or service can prevent...disease unless you possess competent and reliable scientific evidence... substantiating that the claims are true.<sup>27</sup>

The FDA EUA for surgical and/or cloth masks explicitly states, "the labeling must not state or imply... that the [mask] is intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection or related, or for use such as infection prevention or reduction." As you can see from the image below, masks do not claim to keep out viruses.



Illegally mandating an investigational medical therapy generates liability.

There are no efficacy standards on child-sized masks and respirators under OSHA, but there are proven microbial challenges as well as breathing difficulties that are created and exacerbated by masking children.

Requiring children to wear a mask sets the stage for contracting any infection, including COVID-19, and making the consequences of that infection much graver. In essence, a mask may very well put children at an increased risk of infection, and if so, having a far worse outcome.<sup>29</sup>

The fact that mask wearing presents a severe risk of harm to the wearer should – standing alone – not be required for children, particularly given that these children are not ill and have done nothing wrong that would warrant an infringement of their constitutional rights and bodily autonomy. Promoting use of a non-FDA approved, Emergency Use Authorized mask, is unwarranted and illegal. This mandate is in direct conflict with Section 360bbb-3€(1)(A)(ii)(I-III), which requires the wearer to be informed of the option to refuse the wearing of such "device." Misrepresenting the use of a mask as being intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection, and/or misrepresenting masks for use as infection prevention or reduction is a deceptive practice under the FTC. It is clear, there is no waiver of liability under deceptive practices, even under a state of emergency. As such, forcing children to wear masks, or similarly forcing use any other non-FDA approved medical product without the child's (or the child's parental) consent, is illegal and immoral.

This letter serves as official notice that Child's Name does not consent to being forced to wear a mask. Child's Name advocates will not fail to take the maximum action permissible under the law against your organization, and against you personally. Accordingly, I urge you to comply with Federal and State law, and advise children they have a right to refuse or wear a mask as a measure to prevent or reduce infection from COVID-19. Any other course of action is contrary to the law. I am willing to testify as to the veracity of the contents in this document. Please confirm no further pressure will be exerted upon Child's Name to follow this illegal mask mandate, and that Child's Name will not face any retaliatory disciplinary action.

I would like to express my concerns regarding mask mandates for our children.

On June 30, 2021 the Journal of the American Medical Association released a study showing mask wearing in children is more harmful than helpful. The study found that after only 3 minutes of wearing a mask, the carbon dioxide levels in the air inhaled by the children (average age of 10) increased to 13,120 parts per million and 25,000 ppm for children ages 7. https://jamanetwork.com/journals/jamapediatrics/fullarticle/2781743

To put this into perspective, the normal levels of co2 in the air range from 300-500 ppm, according to OSHA. Levels between 2,000 and 5,000 ppm cause headaches, poor concentration, loss of attention, increased heart rate and nausea. Exposure to levels greater than 40,000 ppm may lead to serious oxygen deprivation resulting in permanent brain damage, coma or even death. If levels increased into the tens of thousands after only 3 minutes of mask wearing, I can only imagine what they would be after a full day of wearing one.

I have worked in the medical field for over 10 years. I am not opposed to masks as I have found them to be very useful and helpful in many circumstances. What I am opposed to is forcing everyone to wear a mask. We, as parents, should be given a choice on a decision that will affect our children's health, both physical and mental. Let us do our jobs as parents and choose what we know to be best for our children. Whether that be sending our kids to school with masks or without, the choice should be ours.

Hello Mr. Watson,

Optimistically, we did not sign up for another year of online schooling and working from home in isolation- it was too hard. We hoped our daughter could be vaccinated before school started. We know now that won't happen. Now case numbers are climbing, my daughter is still at risk from this virus, and MCPS is considering not requiring masks.

I am a parent of a Washington 6th grader and a Paxson 2nd grader. I am writing in support of continuing COVID precautionary measures into fall 2021 including requiring that all staff and students in MCPS schools wear masks. Schools were not major sources of transmission last year because of the extensive measures put in place and the outstanding cooperation of staff, students, and families. I know so many, including our family, appreciated these measures and the cooperation because they made it possible for our kids to attend school in person as safely as possible. Continued COVID mitigation strategies are justified because:

- 1) We have accelerated spread in our community. Missoula County reported 52 new cases today and a 20 case per 100,000 person seven day daily average.
- 2) Vaccines are remarkably effective —even against the delta variant— in preventing serious disease, but elementary school and many middle school students are not yet eligible for them. The latest Missoula County Vaccine Data Report indicates that 29.8% of 12-14 year olds and 49.8% of 15-19 year olds are fully vaccinated. The majority of Missoula County residents in the middle school and high school age ranges still have not been vaccinated.
- 3) Kids can get and spread COVID.
- 4) Masks prevent COVID transmission and are best at preventing transmission when everyone is wearing one.

Please continue implementing COVID precautions in schools to keep our kids healthy and in school.

U.S. Education Secretary Miguel Cardona recommends that school systems follow the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's masking guidance for K-12 schools recommending "universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to schools, regardless of vaccination status."

We support that guidance unequivocally. Our child's in-person attendance this fall depends on it.

We are also aware that you are receiving significant commentary promoting claims that are, at best, mistaken and, at worst, lies - including claims that wearing masks increases the carbon dioxide levels in children's blood to an extent that compromises child safety, that masks are ineffective as a preventative/mitigating COVID measure, and that children don't die from COVID.

Those claims are false — and a disservice to the crucial role our schools play in childhood safety, development, and happiness.

Again, thank you for your service and commitment to our children.

I am unable to be present for today's COVID task force meeting, however, I would like my comments submitted for the record.

As a physician I have been on the front lines of dealing with the pandemic for the past 18 months. Over the past few months it appeared that there was a light at the end of the tunnel, infections and deaths had dramatically fallen since the introduction of wide-spread vaccination. However, over the past few weeks there has been an abrupt change in the outlook of this pandemic. The delta variant has thrown us a curveball and we are now seeing exponential growth in infections. The delta variant does not appear to be sparing children like previous variants did. Worldwide there has been a significant increase in childhood deaths related to COVID-19. Here in the United States children's hospitals in areas with low vaccination rates have seen a significant increase in hospitalizations.

Unfortunately, those between ages 5-12 are unable to be vaccinated leaving them vulnerable to this disease. It's true many will either be a symptomatic or mildly symptomatic. Others, however, will end up with long-COVID symptoms and god forbid worse outcomes. We have to take this vulnerable population into consideration with crafting a plan to return to the classroom.

It is vitally important for our kids to be able to return to the classroom. We are never going to eliminate the risk of adverse outcomes, but there are simple, straightforward steps that we can take to reduce the risk of spread.

- 1) Continue to strongly encourage vaccination in all individuals are eligible.
- 2) For employees who have decided not to vaccinate, implement masking with N-95s, face shields, and weekly COVID testing.
- 3) Implement mask mandates for all school age children, regardless of age or vaccination status. It has been shown that vaccinated individuals are still able to spread the disease. We should be attempting to reduce the risk of spread as much as possible.

Again, I feel that it is vitally important to allow kids to return to the classroom this fall, however, we must do so in a safe and logical manner.

Please give out the correct email when you are in a public meeting.

I know I must write this email to you by Aug. 10 since you will vote on whether to force all children in Missoula County Public Schools to wear masks or not on that date at 6 p.m. at the School Board room at 909 South Avenue across from Sentinel High School. I hope you hear from many citizens that are equally concerned about the future of our children's education and mental development. I also hope that the media will do stories about the volume of parents and grandparents that have spoken to the Covid-19 Task Force that will give their recommendations to you on Aug. 10. I will be at the Aug. 10 School Board of Trustees' meeting to speak during the public comment period.

I know the media and public can listen to the testimony by contacting the School Board office if they didn't attend the Covid-19 meetings. The comments are enlightening. I hope you listen to these sincere citizens that took time out from their lives to speak because they are so worried about the welfare of their children.

I fear that you are not listening to the public and especially the parents that are raising our children in Missoula, but I continue to say that children should not wear masks in school. I call masks face diapers. When school opens this fall, children must not be required to wear cloth masks that not only smother fresh air and muffle words but cover up facial expressions and body language so necessary for learning. Wearing a mask while inside hampers proper breathing and forces a human to inhale carbon dioxide as they naturally exhale. Children tell me they become dizzy and develop headaches when they have to wear masks for six to eight hours.

After attending the Covid-19 Task Force meetings where hundreds of parents and grandparents spoke out against masks and a handful of people spoke in favor of masks, I am convinced these members have made up their minds to recommend to you that all children in Missoula County Schools must wear masks, which is a true tragedy.

When children do contract this virus, symptoms are generally mild, except in limited cases where children were already extremely sick with other medical conditions. Thanks to your decisions and that of the superintendent of schools, our Missoula students are more than a year behind academically and suffer from untold academic and mental problems. I talk to children I swim with and attend church with in our community. I know how they have suffered because of your poor decisions.

You have cared more about the adult staff than the children that you are tasked to educate. If you order that children must wear masks, you once again do not have the best intensions in mind for children and care more for adults. You are catering to the Montana Education Association that represents the teacher's union.

My focus of concern is for the students, not the adult staff. Children do not infect adults. Adults infect each other and infect themselves because of their lifestyle choices. THANK YOU so much for your public service. It's a huge commitment, with enormous responsibility. I am writing today specifically regarding your decision-making related to the COVID-19 pandemic. I want you to know you have my support, the support of the majority of residents of Missoula, and most importantly, you have the support of medical science, and HISTORY, to mandate the use of masks for student, Staff and visitors in Missoula County Public schools.

More that 72,000 kids in the USA are currently ill with COVID19 (CNN, 8.4.21) Most of them are having a miserable but survivable experience. Some are dying, horribly, of COVID19 induced pneumonia especially.

Wearing a mask is one part of a practice of hygiene that has helped the world emerge from pandemics in the past until vaccines could be developed and administered. During the four influenza pandemics of the last 100 years, the world was able to significantly decrease deaths by practicing mitigation long before vaccines were fully developed. Almost 3% of the world's population died from the 1918 flu. By the 2009 flu pandemic, 0.001 to 0.007% of the world's population died. This

is due to the careful development of vaccines over time. But quarantine, mask wearing, and proper hygiene keep transmission of disease at a minimum until vaccines can be developed and administered. These practices are known to help even when effective vaccines are refused.

We are up against a unique time in history. Though this is a coronavirus, not an influenza virus, prevention measures do not change. So if you are vaccinated and in a hotspot where the Delta variant is prominent, wear your mask, keep social-distancing, and wash your hands. Mitigation saves lives.

The CDC recommends that schools implement universal indoor masking for all students, teachers, and staff, even among people who are vaccinated.

It should be noted that the CDC issues recommendations, not mandates, so specific policies are still be left up to local and state officials, as well as businesses and schools.

The guidance reflects the changing situation with Delta as well as emerging evidence that vaccinated people may be more likely to get infected with Delta than previous variants, and thus can possibly transmit to others (though this probability is still dramatically lower than if unvaccinated). When cases are high, the chances of any person, vaccinated or unvaccinated getting exposed to the virus is higher, and masks help mitigate this risk.

The CDC guidance should make it easier for those who want to step up precautions in areas where transmission is high.

We know many parents will be relieved at the recommendation for masking in schools since kids under 12 have not yet had an opportunity to be vaccinated. Again, the decision will be down to local schools and districts, but the CDC recommendation should bolster overall support for such policies.

We know the changing CDC guidance has raised some eyebrows over these many months, but we do appreciate our public servants making difficult calls with rapidly changing information. We know this may feel like two steps forward and one step back, but we ARE making progress thanks to vaccinations. With Delta rising, taking a step towards more precautions in areas with high transmission and with lots of unvaccinated people indoors (schools) makes a lot of sense.

#### Dear COVID-19 Committee:

Thank you for your work during this extremely difficult time. On the Missoula Public Schools website (https://www.mcpsmt.org/domain/599) there is posted a statement released by Superintendent Rob Watson on Wednesday, June 3, 2020 which in part states: "As educators, we know the importance of safety and the critical tie to student success. We know that students can't learn when they don't feel safe. In our classrooms and schools, we strive to create a safe environment so that all kids can learn." This was in response to recent human rights and equity struggles but also specifically mentions safety and is an appropriate reminder as you are dealing with how to reopen schools with the COVID-19 pandemic continuing, indeed worsening.

The key must be safety. We know that masking is one important way to lessen the spread of COVID-19 and keep children, staff and their families safe. If it was seen as important last fall and contributed to the ability to keep schools open, it is even MORE important to continue masking this fall with the more transmissible Delta and other variants rampant in our communities. One only has to look to schools in the south that have already opened without masks and had to guarantine large amounts of students and staff due to spread of the Delta variant of COVID-19. https://www. newsweek.com/over-160-students-already-quarantine-arkansas-school-district-dealsdelta-spread-1615475.

The scientific community is clear. Masking should occur in all schools. The CDC states this. The American Society of Pediatric Doctors state this. The actual data shows that COVID-19 is affecting children and the transmission rates are increasing everywhere. Concerningly, long COVID-19 appears to be affecting school age children with 4.4% of the children having symptoms persisting through 28 days, 5.1% among those aged 12-17 and 3.1% of those 5-11 (https://www.thelancet.com/journals/lanchi/article/PIIS2352-4642(21)00198-X/fulltext). Further studies even suggest that vaccinated people can spread COVID-19. With all these things known, it seems the only logical thing, the responsible thing, the safe thing, is to continue universal masking in schools. Especially in elementary schools since those children have not had the chance to be vaccinated vet.

Another area the schools need to be addressing to help stop the spread of COVID-19 is appropriate ventilation in all areas. In addition to ventilation, there should be assessment of whether an investment of portable filters to clean the air in classroom spaces is needed. This would help not only with COVID-19 but the smoke we are

experiencing now and in the future. If funding for this isn't available from federal grants. perhaps this is something the PTA can help with. We would be happy to contribute financially to help purchase appropriate equipment and I would think other parents would as well.

Nick is a physician who works with COVID-19 patients from our community. He knows the data. He sees first-hand the effects of COVID-19 on patients and their families. His STRONG RECOMMENDATION would be for continued masking. And honestly, even then, it might not be enough.

I know you are tired. I am tired. We all are tired. But this is where we must reach down and summon up the courage to continue to do what is right, what is the best for our children, when it is even harder than before and others want to guit. Yes, there are negatives to masking. But it is better than the alternative. I'd rather have a child who hasn't contacted COVID-19 able to get an education wearing a mask than a child whose health is forever compromised. Or a dead child.

Talk to the kids. Kids (especially elementary students) don't have a problem wearing masks, especially if it means being able to be in school with their friends and teachers. It is primarily the adults who are complaining, resistant and ill-informed.

It is choices like these (masking, ventilation and vaccination) that will determine if Missoula is able to move forward and through the pandemic with the least possible harm. We must look out for the most vulnerable in our society and do the best we can for them. And by doing so, we will protect us all and provide an example for our children of how a caring, responsible society responds in times of extreme danger and controversy. That is an education in itself.



Dear Members of the Board of Trustees,

I am writing to provide public comment to the Board of Trustees for your meeting August 10.

I strenuously urge the Board of Trustees to continue to follow the best available public health recommendations put forward by the CDC, the local MCCHD, the AAP, and other respected entities in making public health decisions for the Missoula County Public Schools, based on local conditions. At this time, this means starting the school year requiring that masks be worn by everyone in the building.

My daughter will be a 2nd grader at Chief Charlo Elementary, and my husband is a teacher at Willard. Both were in inperson school last year. That decision, though difficult, was made easier by the numerous precautions taken by MCPS to ensure the safety of students, faculty, and staff.

Neither my husband nor daughter found masks to be difficult or unduly uncomfortable to wear. In fact, masks enabled, they did not inhibit, learning. Since teachers and learners felt safer, the learning environment worked better. My daughter learned and saw that as members of a school community, we do things to take care of each other and keep each other safe. As the community opened up, we felt safer visiting Grandma, knowing that both our school-exposed family members had at least been protected by the fact that everyone in their schools wore masks (I was exposed to far fewer people in my job, but we were masked as well).

Further, research has continued to demonstrate that masks are one of the most effective preventative measures available to us besides, of course, vaccines. Until significantly more people are vaccinated, and so long as the Delta variant (or any subsequent variant) continues to increase numbers in our community, the safe decision for Missoula schools is to start the school requiring masks of all individuals. As the CDC learned from the recent RI outbreak, this is true even for vaccinated people (like teachers or high school students) who can also spread the virus, even if they are highly unlikely to suffer severe cases themselves.

Please demonstrate what we expect our kids to learn at MCPS - that some sources of information are more reliable than others, that expertise is developed through study, learning, testing, and science, and that sometimes we do things not just because it protects us, but also to protect the most vulnerable in our community, including kids who can't be vaccinated yet, their elderly family members, and other at-risk students and faculty and family members, etc. Please require masking by all students, staff, and faculty at MCPS, K-12, regardless of vaccination status, until conditions improve and merit a change to that policy.



## **KEEPING KIDS SAFE**



An evidence-based approach to protecting kids during the school year

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the American Academy of Pediatrics strongly recommend that in order for schools to remain open, which is of critical importance to the education and wellbeing of children and families, certain public health measures must be instituted and adhered to, like universal mask wearing.

#### Delta has changed the game

Why now?

- Delta is 200% more transmissible and results in up to 1000x higher viral load compared to previous variants.
- This translates into a R(0)=6-10. Meaning, on average, one person infects 6-10 people.
   This is similar to the R(0) for chickenpox and higher than the R(0) for smallpox.
- · Vaccinated individuals who become infected can spread the Delta variant to others.

#### Not enough kids are protected for an effective immunity wall

Kids don't have an immunity

- For example, only 30% of children have SARS-CoV-2 antibodies in Texas, meaning a majority of kids have yet to be exposed to COVID-19 (Messiah et al., 2021).
- Many children haven't had the opportunity to be protected by the COVID-19 vaccine.
   Only 12+ are eligible
- · Not enough eligible adolescents are vaccinated.
  - Only 39% of 16-17 year-olds and 27% of 12-15 year-olds are fully vaccinated in the United States (AAP, July 28, 2021)

#### Study after study shows the effectiveness of a layered approach in K-12 schools

- In Missouri, schools that implemented masks, physical distancing, and increased ventilation had much lower transmission than in the community (Dawson et al., 2021)
- We can do it safely during a pandemic.
- In Utah, despite high community incidence and an inability to space students'
  classroom seats ≥6 ft apart, high student mask use resulted in low transmission and
  no school-related outbreaks in 20 Salt Lake County elementary schools (Hershow et
  al., 2021)
- In rural Wisconsin, masking requirements and student cohorting within schools allowed transmission risk to remain low (Falk et al., 2021)
- A study in Florida found a layered approach is especially needed when community spread is high (Doyle et al., 2021)

#### COVID-19 in kids can range from mild to severe illness

- As of July 22, 2021, over 4.1 million COVID-19 pediatric cases have been reported.
   The CDC estimates that the "true" burden is 26,838,244 pediatric cases in the U.S.
- In 23 states, 16,878 pediatric hospitalizations have been reported. The CDC estimates 209,264 cumuative pediatric hospitalizations in the U.S. as a whole.
  - Hospitalization rates for COVID-19 are higher than for the 2009-10 H1N1 pandemic.
- As of May 2021, 3,742 MIS-C cases have been linked to COVID-19.
- Over 400 pediatric deaths have been reported since the beginning of the pandemic.
   Although this seems low compared to adults, COVID-19 is now a top 10 cause of death for adolescents in the United States.
- Mortality is not the only negative outcome. Long COVID-19 (or Post-acute Sequelae of COVID-19 [PASC]) has been reported among kids.
  - The British National Health Service is reporting that 7-8% of kids experience long COVID-19 and is opening new pediatric clinics for long COVID-19 around the country.

#### We need to stop transmission among kids to stop spread in the community.

- Kids spread SARS-CoV-2 as efficiently as adults. Several outbreak investigations have demonstrated transmission among children, adolescents, and young adults, including transmission to older household members.
- Living with a child engaged with in-person school without public health mitigation measures increases the odds of COVID-19 for the household (Lessler et al., 2021)
- Children who got COVID-19 at two Utah daycares spread it to household members (Schwartz et al., 2020)

#### A collective approach is far more effective than an individualistic approach

A collective approach is far more effective.

- While masks provide protection to the wearer, they primarily serve as source control
  and the greatest benefits occur if everyone wears them.
- Kids are highly influenced by peers and teachers. If all peers are required to wear masks, social desirability will play a factor into compliance.
- Using vaccination status to determine who should wear a mask in schools will be a huge burden on teachers and staff and nearly impossible to enforce

Dear Covid Task Force, I recently received information that you were considering lifting the mask mandate at school next year, if my information is correct. Please respond with what you plan to do, with terms I can understand as an autistic 15 going on 16 year old. If my information is correct, please read the rest of this email.

As a high-risk person and as a teen with common sense, this shocks me and is unacceptable from my point of view. I shall endeavor to enumerate the reasons why, for your erstwhile consideration.

- 1. I am a high-risk person, and doing so endangers my well-being.
- Several members of my family are high-risk, and thus this endangers them by proxy.
- 3. The schools will become plague epicenters, and I don't think anyone wants that.
- 4. The virus has killed millions of people, and if by doing this, you kill off most of the next generation, you are setting back progress on several fronts, including getting rid of this virus, since it affects children and adolescents now.
- 5. Some of my friends are high-risk, and this endangers their well-being. I will NOT sit idly by and let that happen.
- 6. I would've thought this task force had more common sense, having been assembled to stop this virus getting any worse. Pfizer is only around 63% effective against the Delta variant, which is the dominant strain in Montana now.

I have been a substitute teacher for MCPS for 6 years. I feel that last year went quite well given the circumstances. I was very happy to see students in school and they were happy to be there as well. I actually did not experience distress from the students about wearing masks. The youngest kids hardly seem to care that they are wearing masks and never got mad about being told to adjust their masks, if they slipped. I think it's more of a problem for adults. I do believe that kids should not wear masks when they are playing outside in their pod groups. I believe there is enough fresh air to dissipate the virus as most kids have plenty of space between themselves.

I've come to your website to find out whether I or our students will be masking up this Fall. After reading through the wide range of public comment already submitted, I'd like to submit an opinion. I think there should be one or two elementary schools that will be mask-free, depending on the number of parents that want their children unmasked. Perhaps the same thing could be done with the middle or high schools. Though, since those over age 12 can be vaccinated, I am less worried about those who refuse the vaccine. If they don't mind the risk of getting sick and passing on Covid to other unvaccinated people, I guess I shouldn't be too concerned about them either. Though, I see some fault with parental opinions that seem to underestimate the problem of the Delta variant for children. Yesterday, I noted the news out of Louisiana, where the Children's Hospital is seeing kids in their hospital with Covid-19 and a few in the ICU. The numbers aren't high, but they far exceed the numbers of sick children for the entire course of the pandemic until now. One-half of their Covid patients are now under age 12. Because of your wise, proactive Covid driven mask mandate last year, MCPS had very successful outcomes in mitigating the transmission of COVID 19.

By April, he was able to return to his high school campus and resume in person instruction and yet, feel safe at the same time. MOA has its positives but is not the same as in person instruction. I implore you to continue the system wide mask mandate as we begin another school year August 30th to include all K - 12 students, staff, custodians, teachers, monitors and school bus drivers. Why?

It is even more critical this next school year to resume your wise and proven mask and covid mitigation protocols Aug 30th and it is no time to relax standards, if anything, to double them down! The reason I say this is because we are currently experiencing nationwide and in Missoula, a new even more dangerous, mortal and infectious Covid threat, a different more highly virulent, transmissable and deadly disease, the Delta Variant Mutation from India!

This new Covid mutation is 200 times more transmissable, contagious and is significantly more deadly with long term effects. In addition, this Delta Variant now in Missoula goes after childrens Immune Systems more successfully unlike last years Covid strain! threatened the Task Force members and attempted to start a ruckus and disrupt both meetings. Supt. Rob Watson did a great job maintaining order. Interestingly, this large, sometimes loud group all believe they are right, had a right to express themselves in a civil tone but some do not reside in the MCPS school district and others with no current children in the school district.

Every single survey and study this well organized opposition group referenced in their testimony related to last years less infectious to children Covid Virus and not our current Delta Variant Covid Strain which currently is a different, mortal infectious disease threat espcially to childrens immature immune systems. Thousands of MCPS parents not present at the Task Force meetings this week who are working in the daytime, on vacation, carrying on with their busy lives are relying on the Task Force and School Board to continue your wise, compassionate and fiduciary duty which is not only educating but protecting students on campuses and not relax the mask mandate and covid protocols in place. You are our elected representatives and we rely on you to also make the tough decisions which now includes holding firm against this new more lethal Covid Delta Variant already in Missoula, maybe even strengthen your current protocols as appropriate. Please keep the mask mandate in force this fall and protect all on MCPS campuses, especially K-8. As parents of a student entering third grade in MCPS, we'd like to add our comments regarding the District's Covid 19 plan.

The current evidence of asymptomatic transmission of the Delta variant, including among and by fully vaccinated individuals, is extremely concerning. This news/data comes to us at the same time that we're learning more children are being affected by the Delta variant - maybe just because it is more transmissible, but from what we've read, it's yet to be determined if it is also more dangerous for young people.

Our son has not attended in-person school for over a year (he participated in MOA last year). We all (including our son) REALLY want him to go back to school in person this month - for his social and academic growth, but also because we are a two working parent family and are not able to sustain serving as his learning coach this academic year.

However, like so many families, we are also concerned about our child's health and the health of all the students and teachers and other personnel who will be interacting together at MCPS schools.

Given these circumstances, we would very much like to see MCPS adopt a policy that requires masks for everyone inside of school buildings. This policy removes some of the worry and desire to ask questions about, for instance, who is vaccinated and who isn't vaccinated. This policy aims to protect everyone. Ideally, we would also like to see vaccines mandated for everyone who works at or attends MCPS who is eligible. To our understanding, this is most likely going to be needed to shift Covid from pandemic to endemic status in the shortest time possible. We also understand, however, that MCPS and other MT organizations are constrained by House Bill 702. I am vehemently opposed to requiring my children to wear masks in public schools. Masking school-aged kids is not based on available scientific evidence, and promotes a harmful learning and socialization environment.

The survival rate of school-aged children with confirmed cases of covid is 99.99% nationally. In Montana, there are no reported covid fatalities for children aged 19 and under.

Locally the immunization rate is 61%, not including those with naturally acquired immunity. If adults remain concerned about contracting covid from children, the onus for protection needs to be on the adults, not on the children who are not at risk. We have been living with covid for 18 months. We know those most at risk: the elderly, the obese, and those with comorbidities. Yet you ask those least likely to be harmed or transmit the virus to bear a disproportionate share of the daily burden.

If you need adults to teach a class, I will be the first to volunteer as a substitute.

You do not understand the psychological and intellectual harm your covid policies are causing. My children are both very successful students academically, socially, and in athletics. They hate school now. Learning of this masking debate left them disgusted with adults and the education system. My son would not return to the classroom if not for school athletics. You are teaching these kids every wrong possible lesson: fear over resilience; neuroticism over rationalism; defeat over optimism. No parent would choose to raise their own children this way.

You are not going to find a zero risk scenario in this environment, including in school. But to ask those least at risk to bear the largest burden is wrong.

To Whom It Concerns:

I would like to see masks required in the schools. My reasons:

- 1. The Centers for Disease Control and the American Association of Pediatrics recommend masks in school. The CDC is the pre-eminent authority around the globe on human health matters. These are educated researchers and doctors telling us what we need to keep our children safe. Not conspiracy-theorists spreading misinformation, disinformation, and lies. I honestly don't understand why equal time and weight is being given to both sides of this "debate".
- 2. The whole "my body, my choice" narrative is not a true choice when the majority of our students are not old enough to have a vaccine as a choice. The choice is being taken away from them. At the very least, please wait to remove a mask policy until ALL families have the choice to have their kids vaccinated and protected, and until the new daily COVID cases are declining instead of rising. With the new Delta variant out there, the infection spread is now more contagious. It's spread is exponential. Before Delta one carrier on average infected 2 other people. Now it is closer to 6 people per infected carrier. Imagine how that will race through a classroom of unvaccinated and unmasked students.
- 3. Since July 29th, nearly 4.2 million children have tested positive for COVID-19 since the onset of the pandemic. Almost 72,000 cases were added the past week. a substantial increase from the prior week when 39,000 cases were reported. The cases are increasing dramatically (source American Academy of Pediatrics). The opposition says that kids don't get as sick and they hardly ever die. They don't talk about long-COVID or MISC-C. They don't talk about teenagers and young adults having strokes. Kids are getting sick, and it can be prevented by wearing a mask, social distancing, and frequent hand-washing. Why would we take the most important step the masks- out of the known solution for reducing the spread of COVID? It doesn't make sense.

I am a parent. My husband and I have 3 children, none of whom are old enough to be vaccinated yet. We were put in the unfair position of deciding at the end of the school year (a very very long school year) if we wanted to continue having our children stay in the Missoula Online Academy, or move to in-person school. Last year's policies worked very well. We were impressed with how low the positive cases were. We felt optimistic that with the vaccine being readily available, and the policies in place for masking, social distancing when able, and hand-washing, we could take on the risk of letting our kids return to in-person. Our now-First Grade twins would get to see what school was really like, they would get to make friends, learn those valuable social skills after a year of online school. Our son, transitioning to junior high, wouldn't miss out on the valuable life skills that only middle school can offer as a young boy approaching his teen years. We were excited to get back to normal. Masked, sure, but much more normal than online school.

Instead, we feel like the rug was pulled out from under us. Enrollment for MOA is closed. Our crystal ball of vaccines, low positivity rates, and school policy designed to protect our children was completely wrong. Instead, we are facing quickly rising COVID cases. We are up to 20 average Daily New Cases per 100k people in the past 7 days. A month ago it was single digits. We were close to being on track for containment, and now, we have skipped all the way to Accelerated Spread. By the time school starts, we could easily be above the 25 cases per mark, which is considered the "tipping point" and if the County Health Dept hadn't been stripped of its powers, would have us back under a county-wide mask mandate. A mask mandate that WORKED.

Please, please keep the mask policy in the schools until the vaccines are available in schools and until the new daily cases of COVID are low again. If you can't do that, you should offer to reopen enrollment in the MOA. Those of us who trusted that our kids would be taken care of deserve at least that chance.

Plainly stated, Covid-19 vaccinations should be required of all students who are currently eligible, specifically, those 12 years of age and up. Additionally, students under age 12 should be vaccinated once an approved vaccine is made available for them.\*

Covid-19 will not be disappearing any time soon. We must adjust to safely living with it. Keeping up one's immunity will, most likely, require periodic boosters for all of us in the future. Getting a vaccination is not a political issue. It's simply a health issue. In getting vaccinated, we are protecting ourselves, our families, our neighbors, and our fellow Americans. Period!

Our children, teachers, and support staff deserve nothing less than a safe environment at school. I would also expect MCPS to follow CDC guidelines with respect to wearing masks. Should the CDC determine that wearing masks indoors is not only needed for unvaccinated students under age 12, but for others as well, (at least for now) to keep the highly contagious Delta variant at bay, so be it!

In conclusion, I thank you for your service to our district. I know your job is not an easy one in the best of times. Being a school board member is not a paid position, but rather a public service. It can be often be an under appreciated position as well. The past eighteen months have been extremely difficult for everyone as we figure out how to survive a pandemic. Dear School Board Trustees, COVID Task Force Members, and Superintendent Watson,

Thank you so much for your service and care for our community and children during this extremely challenging time. I'm sure we all hoped COVID-19 would not continue to be a major consideration when we returned to school this fall. But sadly, with continuing low vaccination rates that have kept us from reaching herd immunity, and mutations of the virus resulting in more contagious variants, COVID-19 remains a major health concern.

To keep our children and community safe, please continue to require masks for all students, teachers, and staff in Missoula County Public Schools. I believe that not doing so will put our children and MCPS staff at significant risk and be a major liability risk for the school district.

In the 2020-21 school year, you all did a wonderful job of making careful, well researched, science-based decisions about COVID safety protocols, implemented the protocols very effectively, and -- most importantly -- kept in-school transmissions low and children and staff as safe as possible. I strongly urge you to continue to use the same strong and effective protocols and decision making processes and criteria you proved were effective last year. Based on the specifics of data in our community -- including rising case loads, Delta variant, lack of herd immunity/relatively low vaccine rates -- and increasing scientific understanding of the COVID-19 virus and it's variants, I believe the MCSP response must include continuing to require masking of all people in the school, ventilation, social distancing when not masked, and ongoing contact tracing and reporting.

I'm sure you are also following the science and experts' recommendations very closely. However, I'm including some evidence to back up my request for maintaining inschool masking and other COVID protocols for the record.

In early July 2021, the CDC guidance recommended that all unvaccinated people in schools continue to wear masks indoors. Virtually all students in elementary school are unvaccinated because they are under 12, and therefore, are not yet eligible for the vaccine. Furthermore, recent studies -- including a recent report from the CDC -- shows that due to the Delta variant or COVID-19, even vaccinated people are increasingly becoming infected and are able to spread the virus. This supports the need for even vaccinated teachers, staff, and students to continue to wear masks indoors to keep unvaccinated children safe from the virus. Finally, a multitude of scientific studies show that masks are highly effective at reducing the spread of COVID in group settings (some examples are provided below)

Hello,

I am writing as a parent of both a Rattlesnake Elementary and Washington Middle School student. Thank-you for all your work to educate my children and keep them safe while doing so. Since the COVID-19 vaccine was made available to teachers, staff and other members of our community over the age of 12 I have been dismayed to read that a substantial number of those eligible to receive it have not done so. In light of this and the fact that almost all the students at Rattlesnake Elementary are under the age of 12 and thus not eligible to be vaccinated, I am hoping that MCPS will require universal wearing of face coverings when groups of potentially unvaccinated individuals are meeting indoors. As recognized by the CDC, the American Academy of Pediatrics, and the Missoula City-County Health department, requiring universal mask wearing reduces the risk of transmission when groups gather indoors. Dear Members of the School Board,

I am writing to request the school district mandate masks in schools for the 2021-2022 year. The plan to make masks optional goes against the guidance of both the Centers for Disease Control and the American Academy of Pediatrics; ignores the science on COVID transmission in kids and on the effectiveness of masks; and fails to give our youngest kids—who are not yet vaccine eligible but will be soon—a chance to evade infection after over a year of sacrifice. All available evidence indicates that SARS-CoV-2 will spread wildly in schools without mitigation efforts—including universal masking—firmly in place. The CDC and the American Academy of Pediatrics agree; both agencies have released guidance indicating that schools should mandate masks for students, staff, and visitors. As a local leader, you should listen to them.

Though infections in our state declined in the late spring and early summer as vaccination rates increased, new variants like Delta pose a serious threat. The Delta variant is much more transmissible than previous variants, and data from our local area reflect that troubling reality. Infections in Missoula County have increased significantly over the last days alone. In addition, the age distribution of new infections and hospitalizations has also shifted downward, with young kids representing a greater proportion of infections and hospitalizations than in previous months. This will only get worse if kids return to school without required masking and other mitigation strategies in place.

The science is clear on COVID and kids is clear: children can be infected with SARS-CoV-2, can get sick with and die of COVID-19, and can spread the virus to others. As of the first week of July 2021, more than 200,000 kids in the U.S. had been

hospitalized and nearly 400 kids had died from COVID. A tragically disproportionate number of these kids who experienced severe illness or death were young people of color, whose social and economic vulnerabilities put them at especially high risk. While kids are less likely than adults to experience severe illness or death, the long term consequences of COVID infection on neurological, lung, metabolic, and cardiovascular function are still unknown. Recent studies estimate that anywhere from 10-45% of kids under 12 who are infected with SARS-CoV-2 experience "long haul" symptoms that last more than five weeks after diagnosis, even if they experience mild acute infection. This is all to say, kids have not been and will not be spared in this pandemic. Importantly, kids can also transmit COVID to their unvaccinated, immunocompromised, and otherwise vulnerable family members and friends, which further contributes to community spread and the emergence of new variants of the virus and puts the "end" of this pandemic further out of reach.

Thankfully, over the past year and a half, we have learned a lot about how to reduce transmission and infections, and masks have emerged as a particularly important, scientifically proven mitigation strategy. Evidence from the CDC shows that the relatively low levels of infections in kids seen during the 2020-2021 school year were, in large part, the result of school closures and widespread mitigation efforts in schools, including mask mandates. Though kids transmit COVID as efficiently as adults and are infected at similar rates to adults, mask mandates in schools prevented high levels of in-school transmission during the 2020-2021 school year. The proven effectiveness of masks is a key reason behind the CDC's and American Academy of Pediatrics' current recommendation that students and staff continue to wear masks in schools during the 2021-2022 school year. Again, the science here is clear: reopening schools without mask mandates and other mitigation efforts in place while the Delta variant surges will result in high levels of transmission and infection in kids, which can further contribute to household and community spread, even among the vaccinated. We shouldn't wait for Delta to spread in schools before putting mask mandates in place; we can and should act in order to prevent any unnecessary disease, death, and suffering.

I think we can all agree that masks were highly effective at preventing illness (cold, flu,

cough, etc) this past school. Our kids were healthier and missed ZERO days of school due to illness, thanks to masks.

Families are depending on you to follow the science and protect the health and safety of our kids and community. Our kids deserve to go to school without worrying about getting sick and spreading the virus to their immunocompromised, unvaccinated, or otherwise vulnerable family members, friends, and neighbors. We shouldn't ask our young kids and their parents to choose between going to school and staying healthy and safe. Young kids will be eligible for vaccines within the next few months. We should give them the opportunity to be vaccinated before asking them to enter our schools and classrooms unprotected. The science supports masks in schools. Wearing masks is a small sacrifice to make in order to ensure that our kids can remain safe while going to school, which we know is important for their intellectual, social, and emotional development.

I am asking you to listen to the experts, follow the science, and reject the plan to make masks optional. Masks should be required, especially for our most vulnerable unvaccinated students. I am happy to be in touch with any comments, questions, or concerns.

#### **Dear MCPS Families:**

Thank you for your interest and questions related to the COVID Reopening Plan for Missoula County Public Schools for the 2021-22 school year. Also, thank you for your patience as we finalized our plan with the latest local and national guidance. In revising the phase 3 plan for the upcoming year our COVID task force remained focused on the safety and welfare of our students, staff and community. You can find the full Phase 3 Reopen Plan HERE.

As you look through our plan, it is important to note that while many of the mitigation strategies are still in place, we expect this year to be much different than last year. As you may recall, we started last year in a hybrid school model, however this year we will be starting with every day for every student and a longer school day than last year. In addition, some of the other pre-COVID school routines will return - lunch in the cafeteria, normal rotation of elective programs, opportunities to participate in school activities programs as well as opportunities for parents to volunteer in the schools. We are excited to start the school year and look forward to offering a different experience than last year, while at the same time maintaining a safe environment for all students and staff.

While we know there continue to be risks related to possible transmission of the COVID-19 virus, we are reflecting on what we have learned about this pandemic over the past year to manage that risk, balance the need for mitigation strategies with the educational needs of students, and forge ahead with recovery efforts. I would like to share relevant details and strategies listed below related to how we intend to operate our schools in the coming months.

#### Mitigation Strategies

We will continue to work with the health department to trace, identify and notify close contacts to all positive COVID cases associated with MCPS. New guidance from the CDC should greatly reduce the number of students considered close contacts, if universal face coverings are used. We will also continue with cleaning procedures, maintenance of our ventilation systems, and enhanced hand hygiene practices.

Classrooms will operate much like they did in pre-COVID times, while maintaining 3 feet or as much as possible between students or groups, while implementing other mitigation strategies.

We will continue to ask that families keep their students home if they are ill, particularly if they are unvaccinated for COVID-19. Testing will be available to all students and staff via MCPS or the Missoula City-County Health Department. A reminder of our family guidance for keeping a child home here.

MCPS will update staff and families on vaccination eligibility and opportunities for 5-11 year-olds and encourage all vaccine-eligible students and staff to consider getting vaccinated, if it is right for you and your family. While COVID vaccines are encouraged, we cannot require COVID vaccines, which is explained in state law HERE.

#### **DRAFT Face Covering Guidelines**

Please note: These guidelines will need to be reviewed and approved by our Board of Trustees. This discussion will occur at the Board meeting on August 10, which starts at 6pm. The meeting will be virtual, on zoom. Please check our website for the zoom link to the meeting. You can also watch the meeting on MCAT. The Board will take verbal public comment over zoom before a final decision is made. You may also provide written comments for the Board to consider, using the following email address: publiccomment@mcpsmt.org .

#### MCPS Face Covering Guidelines and Requirements

# As of August 16, 2021, until further notice, to be reviewed after the first 6 weeks of school.

The following guidelines will be followed in all K-12 MCPS Facilities as well as Administrative Offices.

While indoors and while on MCPS transportation (Beach or other):

- Face coverings are required for all students, staff and volunteers or guests, regardless of vaccination status.
- · Face coverings are not required when outdoors.
- · Face coverings are not required while eating/drinking.
- · In some circumstances, staff may lower face covering while teaching, presenting, speaking or providing directions as long as they can maintain appropriate distance (6ft) from others. This decision will be left to the discretion of the individual staff member. However, face coverings should be used when working with small groups or individual students.
- When working alone, not with students or not with members of the public, staff may remove face
- To be determined by Staff, there will be opportunities for students for routine "mask breaks" throughout the day, if appropriate distancing can be maintained.

# COVID-19 Cases, Hospitalizations Hit Levels Not Seen Since Spring in Missoula County; Health Officials Urge Community to Take Precautions

Missoula City-County Health Officials are urging the community to reignite their diligence in preventing the spread of COVID-19 as cases and hospitalizations in the County hit levels not seen since spring.

On Tuesday, July 27, Missoula County reported 30 new COVID-19 cases— the highest number reported since March 27, 2021 before COVID-19 vaccines were widely available to the general public. There are 100 active cases in the County, a figure not seen since April 12, 2021. Twelve individuals are currently hospitalized in Missoula County, which is the most COVID-19 patients the community has seen since April 20, 2021. Furthermore, the seven-day rolling average of new COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people rose to 12 after hitting an all-time pandemic low of three just four weeks ago on June 26, 2021.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Tuesday reversed course on its recommendation that fully vaccinated individuals could forego masking inside enclosed public areas. With this news, local health officials are urging the public to start wearing masks again.

"Every layer of protection counts right now and dusting those masks off is a wise choice. With the highly transmissible Delta variant present in our community, those who are old enough to get vaccinated should do so immediately. Children 11 and younger especially should wear masks, social distance, and frequently sanitize their hands until a vaccine is approved in their age group," stated Health Officer D'Shane Barnett.

COVID-19 Incident Commander Cindy Farr added, "We are at a critical point where those who have been delaying their vaccines, those who have been hesitating, need to step forward and protect themselves and our community. We have come too far to slide back now."

Health Officials say it is especially critical that parents and guardians get children 12 and older vaccinated against COVID-19 before they head back to the classroom next month, as summer

camps and other child programs have been attributed to large COVID-19 clusters across the nation.

The Health Department's COVID-19 vaccine clinic at the Southgate Mall is open seven days a week; no appointment necessary. All three FDA-authorized vaccines are available each day. COVID-19 vaccine appointments are free to the insured and uninsured. Clinic staff are always available to sit down and discuss any questions or concerns a patient may have before they decide to get vaccinated.

COVID-19 testing is also critical to slowing the spread of the original strain and the highly transmissible Delta variant. All Missoula County residents, whether symptomatic or not, can book free COVID-19 tests at the Flynn Lane testing clinic or at a mobile testing clinic. Individuals who are exposed to large volumes of people at work are especially encouraged to take advantage of this service.

RE: Update to Masking Recommendations in Schools

Dear Montana School Leaders and School Board Members:

We are writing as Montana pediatricians who are also family and community members of the students in your schools. The COVID-19 pandemic has truly had an enormous impact on children. But, unfortunately, this pandemic is not yet over and thus we need to ensure the continued safety of our students.

We send this letter today as you navigate the difficult decision about face masks in schools for the upcoming academic year.

We applaud you and your staff's efforts to continue implementing the other mitigation strategies that have been found to decrease SARS-CoV-2 virus transmission in schools, including physical distancing, ventilation, hand hygiene, cleaning and disinfecting surfaces, and contact tracing, as well as supporting local health care providers who offer the opportunity for vaccination to students 12 years and older. We are writing today to urge you to review the recommendation for universal masking for all students and staff, regardless of vaccination status, as outlined in the national American Academy of Pediatrics updated COVID-19 Guidance for Safe Schools, published July 18, 2021<sup>1</sup>. MTAAP endorses this guidance. Here are some of the main reasons:

- 1. Children younger than 12 years do not have the opportunity to be vaccinated, and will not likely have this opportunity until late fall/early winter. Children can become seriously ill with COVID-19, and can have prolonged symptoms after initial mild or even asymptomatic infection.
- 2. The Delta variant of this virus has now been detected in Montana, and this variant has been found to be much more contagious as well as even cause mild disease in vaccinated people. Cases and hospitalizations are increasing from earlier this month, and the Delta variant is rapidly becoming the predominant variant in Montana.
- 3. Schools will face challenges monitoring masking policies in those who are not vaccinated. Additionally, though fully vaccinated people are very unlikely to become significantly ill with COVID-19 or transmit the virus, the risk is not zero.

4. Face masking has been shown to decrease the spread of other respiratory virus illnesses which mimic COVID-19 symptoms, and therefore decrease teacher and student absences.

Undoubtedly, questions will be raised about the health, socio-emotional and communication hurdles related to masking, but we encourage you to contact your local health care providers, or members of the MTAAP, who should be able to answer these questions. Additionally, the AAP website, <u>HealthyChildren.org</u>, has many resources on these topics, such as <u>Mask Mythbusters</u>.

We remain in support of universal masking in schools, at least until all students have had the opportunity to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 illness. Let us prioritize allowing children to safely attend your schools, which are fundamental for their development and well-being.

SUBJECT: Planning for the 2021-2022 School Year

As you prepare to plan for once again welcoming students back into the classroom for the 2021-2022 school year, I want to first thank you for all of the tremendous work you, your educators, your classified staff, and your administrators have done to not only keep our school doors open in many of your districts, but more importantly keep our students safe and learning. This past year has been unprecedented, and you have been tremendous leaders in your communities, and our wonderful Montana teachers have continued to put our amazing Montana students first.

On February 12, 2021, Governor Greg Gianforte issued a directive implementing Executive Order 2-2021. In the memo, he rightfully noted that "access to school is essential to the development, social, mental, and educational needs of school-age children." Further, he said that "schools should make reasonable efforts to follow school guidelines and best practices recommended by the CDC and the Montana Office of Public Instruction."

Since that time, our state has continued to reopen, and there have been many changes to state and local policies on the required use of masks or face coverings. As a result of a change in state law, many counties have eliminated their requirements for the wearing of masks or face coverings in public space and private businesses.

In light of the changes occurring across the state, as we move into the 2021-2022 school year, the OPI strongly recommends that school districts across Montana rescind, or allow to expire, any existing face covering mandates, and develop policies that make the wearing of face masks and other coverings optional, voluntary, and a matter of family choice. Further, the OPI supports schools making





the decision to remove those mandates for the remainder of the present school year, as well as for any summer instruction programs.

We in Montana have proven that we can keep our children safe and keep them learning. We cannot enter another school year subjecting our students to any additional loss of instructional time. We also cannot perpetuate the notion that masks will be a permanent feature in our state's classrooms. I encourage you to evaluate your policies and work toward removing masks wherever possible.

It is important that our children have as normal a school experience as possible – as soon as possible. This is one way to help accomplish that objective. I sincerely hope your school districts will consider this guidance as they plan for the new school year. Thank you for putting our Montana students first. I am here to serve you if you have any questions.



My child attends Franklin Elementary and after reviewing the draft face covering guidelines, I strongly urge the board to vote in favor of making them final. In particular, it is important to continue relying on the stated rationale to support finalizing the draft guidelines:

#### **RATIONALE**

As provided by MT Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, the CDC and MCCHD.

- Children younger than 12 years do not have the opportunity to be vaccinated, and will not likely have this opportunity until late fall/early winter.
- CDC guidance regarding who is determined to be a close contact has changed to acknowledge the use of face coverings in K-12 settings. Last school year, any student within 6 feet of a positive case would be considered a "close contact" and would have to quarantine, 10-14 days. This school year, if both the positive case and other students are correctly and consistently using face coverings, the other students may not be considered close contacts and may not have to guarantine.
- The Delta variant of this virus has now been detected in Montana, and this variant has been found to be much more contagious as well as even cause mild disease in vaccinated people. Cases and hospitalizations are increasing from earlier this month, and the Delta variant is rapidly becoming the predominant variant in Montana.

Basing decisions that affect the health and safety of my child, and all those in close contact to him, must absolutely be based on the best available science and direction from health experts. Policies recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics, the CDC and MCCHD are necessary to effectively reduce COVID-19 infections.

In no uncertain terms, I strongly urge the board to set aside calls to forego face coverings as they are not based on the best available science and direction from health experts, and represent a fringe (though vocal) minority within our community that may be misinformed, or are motivated by political inclinations rather than what is best for our children's health and the safety of those we seek to protect from this deadly virus.

I'm writing today to express my strong support for a universal mask requirement for all Missoula County Public School students grades K-12 in advance of your meeting to decide this matter on August 10.

I am a family physician and mother of two girls, both of whom are too young to attend public school yet but who attend day care and preschool with the siblings of many MCPS students. I see many MCPS students in my clinic on a regular basis. I am concerned for my own children, my young patients and the entire Missoula community.

Data show that when schools follow guidelines like universal masking, illness exclusion policies and hand hygiene, then outbreaks of COVID-19 are low in schools.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the American Academy of Pediatrics have both recommended that children return to in-person instruction AND that schools implement universal masking. Children under age 12 cannot be vaccinated and in other areas of the country more and more children are getting sick from COVID, and some of them are dying.

Requiring universal masking in schools makes good sense because it is a much easier policy to implement compared to a patchwork of different policies for different grades or student vaccination status. I am sending this email as public comments on the public schools for fall of 2021. Simply put, I expect you to follow—at a minimum—the CDC recommendations. Currently CDC recommends "universal indoor masking by all students, staff, teachers, and visitors to K through 12 schools regardless of vaccination status."

The delta variant also causes me, a parent of a child entering kindergarten, increased concern for my child's safety. We now have evidence of breakthrough infections of vaccinated individuals, but we do not know the rate of those breakthrough infections. We also have evidence that more kids are getting sick due to the Delta variant, but we don't know if a higher proportion of kids contracting Covid have serious complications due to the Delta variant. First of all, thank you for your thorough consideration of public input on the issue of mask wearing. I know that this is a contentious issue and that you have devoted many hours to listening and deliberating among different options. This task has been arduous and even unpleasant at times. I believe that you will make a thoughtful decision based on the welfare of the MCPS community.

I support universal mask wearing in MCPS this coming school year for the following reasons:

- 1) The Delta variant is far more potent and transmissible than the original COVID virus. It is relatively new, and the medical community is still learning about it. Children have not been shown to have any special protection against it.

Dear COVID Taskforce,

In reviewing the proposed COVID guidelines for the upcoming school year, I was shocked at how lax they were. This pandemic is far from over, and the increasing rate at which variants such as Delta are arising should drive home just how much work must still be done before we can consider things "back to normal".

I was pleased to see that the CDC guidelines released today recommend masking and distancing going into this fall. Quite frankly, however, for the sake of our children's safety, CDC guidelines should be seen as a step below what is necessary. In order to curb what has proven to be a highly infectious and extremely mutation-prone virus, our actions must be just as decisive and adaptive. Once Delta reaches the school, we will have already missed the optimal window for restrictions to be effective. There is no reason to inflict this on students or their families when we have the power to think ahead and prevent a worst-case scenario.

In this vein, MCPS has the opportunity to take steps to decisively prevent our schools from becoming hot spots or, worse yet, breeding grounds for the next variant. I would request that the Taskforce consider the following modifications to CDC guidance:

- Vaccinations are mandatory for all students and staff electing to attend in-person. We already require inoculations for measles, polio, and mumps, among others. Given the severity of this disease compared to the aforementioned, its eradication should be handled similarly - through strict vaccination policy. We did it with smallpox, we can do it again.
- · At-home options for those unable/unwilling to vaccinate. While there is no doubt that in-person learning is more beneficial to children than remote, not dying or killing those around them is considerably more impactful to their education in the long run. If this is not feasible, the parents of the unvaccinated can shoulder the burden of the cost of providing their own in-home tutors as those of us who followed guidelines did last year.
- · Masking is enforced with extreme prejudice. Failure to properly and consistently mask needs to be treated with the same "no tolerance" attitude as bullying. Masking, while unpleasant, is not difficult: failure to do so should result in loss of privileges or suspension due to the impact it could have on students' well-being. Teachers and staff need to be given the authority and backing of the school system when it comes to enforcing these guidelines.

I understand that the topic of vaccinations can be sensitive for those unacquainted with how science, pharmacology, and virology operate. However, this science has existed for decades and has been proven to work time and again. In the face of a health crisis of this magnitude, politics, religion, and non-scientific opinions simply have no place. I am vaccinated and have had no ill effects from it whatsoever. Neither has any member of my family, all but the youngest of whom are fully vaccinated. This includes my immunocompromised son who normally can't get vaccines due to an allergy to the culturing proteins and wife who is still embroiled in a battle against cancer and is unable to fight off even minor infections. My family cannot afford to have COVID or any of its variants make their way into our home.

As you convene to discuss whether it's a good idea to mask children for 6+ hours a day when school starts in the fall, please soberly consider what further damage this will do to our children. The physical and psychological harm that forcing our children to mask and be taught by masked instructors is widely understood and obvious. We don't need to apply partisan pseudo-science while leaving our rationality at the door to understand this or to see it for ourselves with our own eyes.

Face masks have many side effects including reduced blood oxygen levels, elevated carbon dioxide levels, chronic stress and anxiety attacks. They contribute to headaches, withdrawal behaviors, shortness of breath/hyperventilation, chest pain, immunosuppression, hypoxia, insomnia, depression, fatique, increased skin temperature, skin rashes, compromised cognitive performance, dizziness, listlessness and increased heart rate just to name a few. They are also a major threat to a child's development and ability to read expressions. The ability to see, appreciate and communicate through facial expressions is crucial to a child's social development. These conditions are harmful and abusive for Missoula's school children.

In addition, the "science" (which may be more properly characterized as political partisan and biased, not to mention constantly conflicting, interpretation of inconclusive and inadequate data) has failed to demonstrate any reasonable correlation between widespread public mask wearing and the mitigation of the spread of respiratory viral illness pandemics. Masks are available and there is no reason they should not be allowed for those that choose to wear them. This includes both children and educators. An additional layer of protection is widely available for free in the form of a vaccine which is apparently highly affective in inoculating parents, teachers and children from the risk of infection. With these tools readily available for use by anyone that personally perceives this risk for themselves or their children, there is no reason to mandate or compel everyone to do the same if doing so violates their own perceived risk evaluation of the situation and wishes for the well being of their own children.

In light of the arguments and evidence of the harmful side effects of masking children and the readily available tools for potentially mitigating the threat of infection on an individual and voluntary basis, mandating this policy would be not only unnecessary to ensure the safety of the community, but it would likely cause far more harm than the very threat it is intended to mitigate. There is simply no compelling or rational reason to mandate masking are children at school.

Dear Parents, Teachers, Administrators and children of Missoula Public Schools.

I am writing to express my honest Opinions and facts about the validity, value and potential dangers of forcing children to wear masks for an extended period or at all. I understand that there are many opinions about the value of masks in the prevention of the spread of infectious diseases such as covid. I understand that many people are afraid of being exposed to infectious pathogens and the potential illnesses being caused by such exposure. Facemasks in the COVID-19 era: A health hypothesis

### Introduction

Facemasks are part of non-pharmaceutical interventions providing some breathing barrier to the mouth and nose that have been utilized for reducing the transmission of respiratory pathogens [11]. Facemasks can be medical and non-medical, where two types of the medical masks primarily used by healthcare workers [11], [21]. The first type is National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH)-certified N95 mask, a filtering face-piece respirator, and the second type is a surgical mask [11]. The designed and intended uses of N95 and surgical masks are different in the type of protection they potentially provide. The N95s are typically composed of electret filter media and seal tightly to the face of the wearer, whereas surgical masks are generally loose fitting and may or may not contain electret-filtering media. The N95s are designed to reduce the wearer's inhalation exposure to infectious and harmful particles

from the environment such as during extermination of insects. In contrast, surgical masks are designed to provide a barrier protection against splash, spittle and other body fluids to spray from the wearer (such as surgeon) to the sterile environment (patient during operation) for reducing the risk of contamination [1].

The third type of facemasks are the non-medical cloth or fabric masks. The non-medical facemasks are made from a variety of woven and non-woven materials such as Polypropylene, Cotton, Polyester, Cellulose, Gauze and Silk. Although non-medical cloth or fabric facemasks are neither a medical device nor personal protective equipment, some standards have been developed by the French Standardization Association (AFNOR Group) to define a minimum performance for filtration and breathability capacity [2]. The current article reviews the scientific evidences with respect to safety and efficacy of wearing facemasks, describing the physiological and psychological effects and the potential long-term consequences on health.

## Hypothesis

On January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) announced a global public health emergency of severe acute respiratory syndrome-coronavirus-2 (SARS-CoV-2) causing illness of coronavirus disease-2019 (COVID-19) [3]. As of October 1, 2020, worldwide 34,166,633 cases were reported and 1,018,876 have died with virus diagnosis. Interestingly, 99% of the detected cases with SARS-CoV-2 are asymptomatic or have mild condition, which contradicts with the virus name (severe acute respiratory syndrome-coronavirus-2) [4]. Although infection fatality rate (number of death cases divided by number of reported cases) initially seems quite high 0.029 (2.9%) [4], this overestimation related to limited number of COVID-19 tests performed which biases towards higher rates. Given the fact that asymptomatic or minimally symptomatic cases is several times higher than the number of reported cases, the case fatality rate is considerably less than 1% [5]. This was confirmed by the head of National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases from US stating, "the overall clinical consequences of COVID-19 are similar to those of severe seasonal influenza" [5], having a case fatality rate of approximately 0.1% [5], [6], [7], [8]. In addition, data from hospitalized patients with COVID-19 and general public indicate that the majority of deaths were among older and chronically ill individuals, supporting the possibility that the virus may exacerbates existing conditions but rarely causes death by itself [91, [10]]. SARS-CoV-2 primarily affects respiratory system and can cause complications such as acute respiratory distress syndrome (ARDS), respiratory failure and death [3], [9]. It is not clear however, what the scientific and clinical basis for wearing facemasks as protective strategy, given the fact that facemasks restrict breathing, causing hypoxemia and hypercapnia and increase the risk for respiratory complications, selfcontamination and exacerbation of existing chronic conditions [2], [11], [12], [13], [14].

Of note, hyperoxia or oxygen supplementation (breathing air with high partial O<sub>2</sub> pressures that above the sea levels) has been well established as therapeutic and curative practice for variety acute and chronic conditions including respiratory complications [11], [15]. It fact, the current standard of care practice for treating hospitalized patients with COVID-19 is breathing 100% oxygen [16], [17], [18]. Although several countries mandated wearing facemask in health care settings and public areas, scientific evidences are lacking supporting their efficacy for reducing morbidity or mortality associated with infectious or viral diseases [2], [14], [19]. Therefore, it has been hypothesized: 1) the practice of wearing facemasks has compromised safety and efficacy profile, 2) Both medical and non-medical facemasks are

ineffective to reduce human-to-human transmission and infectivity of SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19, 3) Wearing facemasks has adverse physiological and psychological effects, 4) Long-term consequences of wearing facemasks on health are detrimental.

## **Evolution of hypothesis**

## **Breathing Physiology**

Breathing is one of the most important physiological functions to sustain life and health. Human body requires a continuous and adequate oxygen (O<sub>2</sub>) supply to all organs and cells for normal function and survival. Breathing is also an essential process for removing metabolic byproducts [carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>)] occurring during cell respiration [12], [13]. It is well established that acute significant deficit in O<sub>2</sub> (hypoxemia) and increased levels of CO<sub>2</sub> (hypercapnia) even for few minutes can be severely harmful and lethal, while chronic hypoxemia and hypercapnia cause health deterioration, exacerbation of existing conditions, morbidity and ultimately mortality [11], [20], [21], [22]. Emergency medicine demonstrates that 5–6 min of severe hypoxemia during cardiac arrest will cause brain death with extremely poor survival rates [20], [21], [22], [23]. On the other hand, chronic mild or moderate hypoxemia and hypercapnia such as from wearing facemasks resulting in shifting to higher contribution of anaerobic energy metabolism, decrease in pH levels and increase in cells and blood acidity, toxicity, oxidative stress, chronic inflammation, immunosuppression and health deterioration [24], [11], [12], [13].

### **Efficacy of facemasks**

The physical properties of medical and non-medical facemasks suggest that facemasks are ineffective to block viral particles due to their difference in scales  $\frac{[16],[17],[25]}{[16],[17],[25]}$ . According to the current knowledge, the virus SARS-CoV-2 has a diameter of 60 nm to 140 nm [nanometers (billionth of a meter)]  $\frac{[16],[17]}{[16],[17]}$ , while medical and non-medical facemasks' thread diameter ranges from 55  $\mu$ m to 440  $\mu$ m [micrometers (one millionth of a meter), which is more than 1000 times larger  $\frac{[25]}{[25]}$ . Due to the difference in sizes between SARS-CoV-2 diameter and facemasks thread diameter (the virus is 1000 times smaller), SARS-CoV-2 can easily pass through any facemask  $\frac{[25]}{[25]}$ . In addition, the efficiency filtration rate of facemasks is poor, ranging from 0.7% in non-surgical, cotton-gauze woven mask to 26% in cotton sweeter material  $\frac{[2]}{[25]}$ . With respect to surgical and N95 medical facemasks, the efficiency filtration rate falls to 15% and 58%, respectively when even small gap between the mask and the face exists  $\frac{[25]}{[25]}$ .

Clinical scientific evidence challenges further the efficacy of facemasks to block human-to-human transmission or infectivity. A randomized controlled trial (RCT) of 246 participants [123 (50%) symptomatic)] who were allocated to either wearing or not wearing surgical facemask, assessing viruses transmission including coronavirus [26]. The results of this study showed that among symptomatic individuals (those with fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose ect...) there was no difference between wearing and not wearing facemask for coronavirus droplets transmission of particles of >5  $\mu$ m. Among asymptomatic individuals, there was no droplets or aerosols coronavirus detected from any participant with or without the mask, suggesting that asymptomatic individuals do not transmit or infect other people [26]. This was further supported by a study on infectivity where 445 asymptomatic individuals were exposed to asymptomatic SARS-CoV-2 carrier (been positive for SARS-CoV-2) using close contact

(shared quarantine space) for a median of 4 to 5 days. The study found that none of the 445 individuals was infected with SARS-CoV-2 confirmed by real-time reverse transcription polymerase  $\frac{[27]}{}$ .

A *meta*-analysis among health care workers found that compared to no masks, surgical mask and N95 respirators were not effective against transmission of viral infections or influenza-like illness based on six RCTs [28]. Using separate analysis of 23 observational studies, this *meta*-analysis found no protective effect of medical mask or N95 respirators against SARS virus [28]. A recent systematic review of 39 studies including 33,867 participants in community settings (self-report illness), found no difference between N95 respirators versus surgical masks and surgical mask versus no masks in the risk for developing influenza or influenza-like illness, suggesting their ineffectiveness of blocking viral transmissions in community settings [29].

Another *meta*-analysis of 44 non-RCT studies (n = 25,697 participants) examining the potential risk reduction of facemasks against SARS, middle east respiratory syndrome (MERS) and COVID-19 transmissions <sup>[30]</sup>. The *meta*-analysis included four specific studies on COVID-19 transmission (5,929 participants, primarily health-care workers used N95 masks). Although the overall findings showed reduced risk of virus transmission with facemasks, the analysis had severe limitations to draw conclusions. One of the four COVID-19 studies had zero infected cases in both arms, and was excluded from *meta*-analytic calculation. Other two COVID-19 studies had unadjusted models, and were also excluded from the overall analysis. The *meta*-analytic results were based on only one COVID-19, one MERS and 8 SARS studies, resulting in high selection bias of the studies and contamination of the results between different viruses. Based on four COVID-19 studies, the *meta*-analysis failed to demonstrate risk reduction of facemasks for COVID-19 transmission, where the authors reported that the results of *meta*-analysis have low certainty and are inconclusive <sup>[30]</sup>.

In early publication the WHO stated that "facemasks are not required, as no evidence is available on its usefulness to protect non-sick persons" [14]. In the same publication, the WHO declared that "cloth (e.g. cotton or gauze) masks are not recommended under any circumstance" [14]. Conversely, in later publication the WHO stated that the usage of fabric-made facemasks (Polypropylene, Cotton, Polyester, Cellulose, Gauze and Silk) is a general community practice for "preventing the infected wearer transmitting the virus to others and/or to offer protection to the healthy wearer against infection (prevention)" [2]. The same publication further conflicted itself by stating that due to the lower filtration, breathability and overall performance of fabric facemasks, the usage of woven fabric mask such as cloth. and/or non-woven fabrics, should only be considered for infected persons and not for prevention practice in asymptomatic individuals [2]. The Central for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) made similar recommendation, stating that only symptomatic persons should consider wearing facemask. while for asymptomatic individuals this practice is not recommended [31]. Consistent with the CDC, clinical scientists from Departments of Infectious Diseases and Microbiology in Australia counsel against facemasks usage for health-care workers, arguing that there is no justification for such practice while normal caring relationship between patients and medical staff could be compromised [32]. Moreover, the WHO repeatedly announced that "at present, there is no direct evidence (from studies on COVID-19) on the effectiveness face masking of healthy people in the community to prevent infection of respiratory viruses, including COVID-19"[2]. Despite these controversies, the potential harms and risks of wearing facemasks were clearly acknowledged. These including self-contamination due to hand practice or nonreplaced when the mask is wet, soiled or damaged, development of facial skin lesions, irritant dermatitis or worsening acne and psychological discomfort. Vulnerable populations such as people with mental

health disorders, developmental disabilities, hearing problems, those living in hot and humid environments, children and patients with respiratory conditions are at significant health risk for complications and harm [2].

### Physiological effects of wearing facemasks

Wearing facemask mechanically restricts breathing by increasing the resistance of air movement during both inhalation and exhalation process [12], [13]. Although, intermittent (several times a week) and repetitive (10-15 breaths for 2-4 sets) increase in respiration resistance may be adaptive for strengthening respiratory muscles [33], [34], prolonged and continues effect of wearing facemask is maladaptive and could be detrimental for health [11], [12], [13]. In normal conditions at the sea level, air contains 20.93% O<sub>2</sub> and 0.03% CO<sub>2</sub>, providing partial pressures of 100 mmHg and 40 mmHg for these gases in the arterial blood, respectively. These gas concentrations significantly altered when breathing occurs through facemask. A trapped air remaining between the mouth, nose and the facemask is rebreathed repeatedly in and out of the body, containing low O<sub>2</sub> and high CO<sub>2</sub> concentrations, causing hypoxemia and hypercapnia [35], [36], [11], [12], [13]. Severe hypoxemia may also provoke cardiopulmonary and neurological complications and is considered an important clinical sign in cardiopulmonary medicine [37], [38], [39], [40], [41], [42]. Low oxygen content in the arterial blood can cause myocardial ischemia, serious arrhythmias, right or left ventricular dysfunction, dizziness, hypotension, syncope and pulmonary hypertension [43]. Chronic low-grade hypoxemia and hypercapnia as result of using facemask can cause exacerbation of existing cardiopulmonary, metabolic, vascular and neurological conditions [37], [38], [39], [40], [41], [42]. Table 1 summarizes the physiological, psychological effects of wearing facemask and their potential long-term consequences for health.

In addition to hypoxia and hypercapnia, breathing through facemask residues bacterial and germs components on the inner and outside layer of the facemask. These toxic components are repeatedly rebreathed back into the body, causing self-contamination. Breathing through facemasks also increases temperature and humidity in the space between the mouth and the mask, resulting a release of toxic particles from the mask's materials  $^{[1],[2],[19],[26],[35],[36]}$ . A systematic literature review estimated that aerosol contamination levels of facemasks including 13 to 202,549 different viruses  $^{[1]}$ . Rebreathing contaminated air with high bacterial and toxic particle concentrations along with low  $O_2$  and high  $CO_2$  levels continuously challenge the body homeostasis, causing self-toxicity and immunosuppression  $^{[1],[2],[19],[26],[35],[36]}$ .

A study on 39 patients with renal disease found that wearing N95 facemask during hemodialysis significantly reduced arterial partial oxygen pressure (from PaO<sub>2</sub> 101.7 to 92.7 mm Hg), increased respiratory rate (from 16.8 to 18.8 breaths/min), and increased the occurrence of chest discomfort and respiratory distress <sup>[35]</sup>. Respiratory Protection Standards from Occupational Safety and Health Administration, US Department of Labor states that breathing air with O<sub>2</sub> concentration below 19.5% is considered oxygen-deficiency, causing physiological and health adverse effects. These include increased breathing frequency, accelerated heartrate and cognitive impairments related to thinking and coordination <sup>[36]</sup>. A chronic state of mild hypoxia and hypercapnia has been shown as primarily mechanism for developing cognitive dysfunction based on animal studies and studies in patients with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease <sup>[44]</sup>.

The adverse physiological effects were confirmed in a study of 53 surgeons where surgical facemask were used during a major operation. After 60 min of facemask wearing the oxygen saturation dropped by more than 1% and heart rate increased by approximately five beats/min [45]. Another study among 158 health-care workers using protective personal equipment primarily N95 facemasks reported that 81% (128 workers) developed new headaches during their work shifts as these become mandatory due to COVID-19 outbreak. For those who used the N95 facemask greater than 4 h per day, the likelihood for developing a headache during the work shift was approximately four times higher [Odds ratio = 3.91, 95% CI (1.35–11.31) p = 0.012], while 82.2% of the N95 wearers developed the headache already within  $\leq$ 10 to 50 min [46].

With respect to cloth facemask, a RCT using four weeks follow up compared the effect of cloth facemask to medical masks and to no masks on the incidence of clinical respiratory illness, influenza-like illness

and laboratory-confirmed respiratory virus infections among 1607 participants from 14 hospitals [19]. The results showed that there were no difference between wearing cloth masks, medical masks and no masks for incidence of clinical respiratory illness and laboratory-confirmed respiratory virus infections. However, a large harmful effect with more than 13 times higher risk [Relative Risk = 13.25 95% CI (1.74 to 100.97) was observed for influenza-like illness among those who were wearing cloth masks [19]. The study concluded that cloth masks have significant health and safety issues including moisture retention, reuse, poor filtration and increased risk for infection, providing recommendation against the use of cloth masks [19].

## Psychological effects of wearing facemasks

Psychologically, wearing facemask fundamentally has negative effects on the wearer and the nearby person. Basic human-to-human connectivity through face expression is compromised and self-identity is somewhat eliminated [47], [48], [49]. These dehumanizing movements partially delete the uniqueness and individuality of person who wearing the facemask as well as the connected person [49]. Social connections and relationships are basic human needs, which innately inherited in all people, whereas reduced human-to-human connections are associated with poor mental and physical health [50], [51]. Despite escalation in technology and globalization that would presumably foster social connections, scientific findings show that people are becoming increasingly more socially isolated, and the prevalence of loneliness is increasing in last few decades [50], [52]. Poor social connections are closely related to isolation and loneliness, considered significant health related risk factors [50], [51], [52], [53].

A *meta*-analysis of 91 studies of about 400,000 people showed a 13% increased morality risk among people with low compare to high contact frequency <sup>[53]</sup>. Another *meta*-analysis of 148 prospective studies (308,849 participants) found that poor social relationships was associated with 50% increased mortality risk. People who were socially isolated or fell lonely had 45% and 40% increased mortality risk, respectively. These findings were consistent across ages, sex, initial health status, cause of death and follow-up periods <sup>[52]</sup>. Importantly, the increased risk for mortality was found comparable to smoking and exceeding well-established risk factors such as obesity and physical inactivity <sup>[52]</sup>. An umbrella review of 40 systematic reviews including 10 *meta*-analyses demonstrated that compromised social relationships were associated with increased risk of all-cause mortality, depression, anxiety suicide, cancer and overall physical illness <sup>[51]</sup>.

As described earlier, wearing facemasks causing hypoxic and hypercapnic state that constantly challenges the normal homeostasis, and activates "fight or flight" stress response, an important survival mechanism in the human body [11], [12], [13]. The acute stress response includes activation of nervous, endocrine, cardiovascular, and the immune systems [47], [54], [55], [56]. These include activation of the limbic part of the brain, release stress hormones (adrenalin, neuro-adrenalin and cortisol), changes in blood flow distribution (vasodilation of peripheral blood vessels and vasoconstriction of visceral blood vessels) and activation of the immune system response (secretion of macrophages and natural killer cells) [47], [48]. Encountering people who wearing facemasks activates innate stress-fear emotion, which is fundamental to all humans in danger or life threating situations, such as death or unknown, unpredictable outcome. While acute stress response (seconds to minutes) is adaptive reaction to challenges and part of the survival mechanism, chronic and prolonged state of stress-fear is maladaptive and has detrimental effects on physical and mental health. The repeatedly or continuously activated stress-fear response

causes the body to operate on survival mode, having sustain increase in blood pressure, proinflammatory state and immunosuppression [47], [48].

## Long-Term health consequences of wearing facemasks

Long-term practice of wearing facemasks has strong potential for devastating health consequences. Prolonged hypoxic-hypercapnic state compromises normal physiological and psychological balance, deteriorating health and promotes the developing and progression of existing chronic diseases [23], [38], [39], [43], [47], [48], [57], [11], [12], [13]. For instance, ischemic heart disease caused by hypoxic damage to the myocardium is the most common form of cardiovascular disease and is a number one cause of death worldwide (44% of all non-communicable diseases) with 17.9 million deaths occurred in 2016 [57]. Hypoxia also playing an important role in cancer burden [58]. Cellular hypoxia has strong mechanistic feature in promoting cancer initiation, progression, metastasis, predicting clinical outcomes and usually presents a poorer survival in patients with cancer. Most solid tumors present some degree of hypoxia, which is independent predictor of more aggressive disease, resistance to cancer therapies and poorer clinical outcomes [59], [60]. Worth note, cancer is one of the leading causes of death worldwide, with an estimate of more than 18 million new diagnosed cases and 9.6 million cancer-related deaths occurred in 2018 [61].

With respect to mental health, global estimates showing that COVID-19 will cause a catastrophe due to collateral psychological damage such as quarantine, lockdowns, unemployment, economic collapse, social isolation, violence and suicides [62], [63], [64]. Chronic stress along with hypoxic and hypercapnic conditions knocks the body out of balance, and can cause headaches, fatigue, stomach issues, muscle tension, mood disturbances, insomnia and accelerated aging [47], [48], [65], [66], [67]. This state suppressing the immune system to protect the body from viruses and bacteria, decreasing cognitive function, promoting the developing and exacerbating the major health issues including hypertension, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, cancer, Alzheimer disease, rising anxiety and depression states, causes social isolation and loneliness and increasing the risk for prematurely mortality [47], [48], [51], [56], [66].

#### Conclusion

The existing scientific evidences challenge the safety and efficacy of wearing facemask as preventive intervention for COVID-19. The data suggest that both medical and non-medical facemasks are ineffective to block human-to-human transmission of viral and infectious disease such SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19, supporting against the usage of facemasks. Wearing facemasks has been demonstrated to have substantial adverse physiological and psychological effects. These include hypoxia, hypercapnia, shortness of breath, increased acidity and toxicity, activation of fear and stress response, rise in stress hormones, immunosuppression, fatigue, headaches, decline in cognitive performance, predisposition for viral and infectious illnesses, chronic stress, anxiety and depression. Long-term consequences of wearing facemask can cause health deterioration, developing and progression of chronic diseases and premature death. Governments, policy makers and health organizations should utilize prosper and scientific evidence-based approach with respect to wearing facemasks, when the latter is considered as preventive intervention for public health.

Dear MCPS Trustees,

I am writing to you in my capacities as a physician in our community, an MCPS parent of two COVID-vaccinated students (ages 12 and 14) and as the physician member of the Missoula City-County Board of Health.

As you are well aware, we are experiencing another uptick in COVID disease activity, including increased hospitalizations and deaths. This increase is being fueled by the delta variant, which has shown an increased ability to be transmitted. even among vaccinated individuals. While universal vaccination is the best possible protection against a resurgence of COVID in our community, the majority of our MCPS students will not be eligible for vaccination until sometime in the fall or early winter. Current Missoula County vaccination rates stand at around 30% for 12-14 year olds and 50% for 15-19 year olds.

I strongly urge you to require universal masking for students, teachers and staff in MCPS schools for the start of the fall semester. The CDC, American Academy of Pediatrics and others have issued well-reasoned and researched guidance recommending masking in schools. I understand that this issue is controversial, but the science is clear. Masking is probably one of the most effective and least disruptive COVID mitigation measures available to schools, especially until more of our children are eligible for vaccination. Universal masking in schools is likely to significantly reduce the number of students, teachers and staff who will require absence from school or work for either COVID illness or quarantine after exposure. This is one of the most important things you can do to keep all of our students in school and reduce the transmission of COVID in our community.

As an aside, I would encourage MCPS to do whatever you can to encourage vaccination of all eligible MCPS students. teachers and staff, up to and including vaccination requirements to attend in-person school or participate in extracurricular activities or group travel.

Finally, I would like to applaud all of you for your leadership over the past year. I believe MCPS has been a model for transparency, clarity and public accountability in decisionmaking around COVID. You have made good decisions that have kept our kids in school and protected the public health. Keep up the good work,

Thank you for your interest and questions related to the COVID Reopening Plan for Missoula County Public Schools for the 2021-22 school year. Also, thank you for your patience as we finalized our plan with the latest local and national guidance. In revising the phase 3 plan for the upcoming year our COVID task force remained focused on the safety and welfare of our students, staff and community. You can find the full Phase 3 Reopen Plan HERE.

As you look through our plan, it is important to note that while many of the mitigation strategies are still in place, we expect this year to be much different than last year. As you may recall, we started last year in a hybrid school model. however this year we will be starting with every day for every student and a longer school day than last year. In addition, some of the other pre-COVID school routines will return - lunch in the cafeteria, normal rotation of elective programs, opportunities to participate in school activities programs as well as opportunities for parents to volunteer in the schools. We are excited to start the school year and look forward to offering a different experience than last year. while at the same time maintaining a safe environment for all students and staff,

While we know there continue to be risks related to possible transmission of the COVID-19 virus, we are reflecting on what we have learned about this pandemic over the past year to manage that risk, balance the need for mitigation strategies with the educational needs of students, and forge ahead with recovery efforts. I would like to share relevant details and strategies listed below related to how we intend to operate our schools in the coming months.

## **Mitigation Strategies**

We will continue to work with the health department to trace, identify and notify close contacts to all positive COVID cases associated with MCPS. New guidance from the CDC should greatly reduce the number of students considered close contacts, if universal face coverings are used. We will also continue with cleaning procedures, maintenance of our ventilation systems, and enhanced hand hygiene practices.

Classrooms will operate much like they did in pre-COVID times, while maintaining 3 feet or as much as possible between students or groups, while implementing other mitigation strategies.

#### **Dear MCPS Families:**

Thank you for your interest and questions related to the COVID Reopening Plan for Missoula County Public Schools for the 2021-22 school year. Also, thank you for your patience as we finalized our plan with the latest local and national guidance. In revising the phase 3 plan for the upcoming year our COVID task force remained focused on the safety and welfare of our students, staff and community. You can find the full Phase 3 Reopen Plan HERE.

As you look through our plan, it is important to note that while many of the mitigation strategies are still in place. we expect this year to be much different than last year. As you may recall, we started last year in a hybrid school model. however this year we will be starting with every day for every student and a longer school day than last year. In addition, some of the other pre-COVID school routines will return - lunch in the cafeteria, normal rotation of elective programs, opportunities to participate in school activities programs as well as opportunities for parents to volunteer in the schools. We are excited to start the school year and look forward to offering a different experience than last year. while at the same time maintaining a safe environment for all students and staff.

While we know there continue to be risks related to possible transmission of the COVID-19 virus, we are reflecting on what we have learned about this pandemic over the past year to manage that risk, balance the need for mitigation strategies with the educational needs of students, and forge ahead with recovery efforts. I would like to share relevant details and strategies listed below related to how we intend to operate our schools in the coming months.

#### **Mitigation Strategies**

We will continue to work with the health department to trace, identify and notify close contacts to all positive COVID cases associated with MCPS. New guidance from the CDC should greatly reduce the number of students considered close contacts, if universal face coverings are used. We will also continue with cleaning procedures, maintenance of our ventilation systems, and enhanced hand hygiene practices.

Classrooms will operate much like they did in pre-COVID times, while maintaining 3 feet or as much as possible between students or groups, while implementing other mitigation strategies.

We will continue to ask that families keep their students home if they are ill, particularly if they are unvaccinated for COVID-19. Testing will be available to all students and staff via MCPS or the Missoula City-County Health Department. A reminder of our family guidance for keeping a child home here.

MCPS will update staff and families on vaccination eligibility and opportunities for 5-11 year-olds and encourage all vaccine-eligible students and staff to consider getting vaccinated, if it is right for you and your family. While COVID vaccines are encouraged, we cannot require COVID vaccines, which is explained in state law HERE.

Hello,

First I want to thank the Covid task force for the job they've done over the last 18 months. It's no easy task and they've handled the unknown very well.

I'm writing in opposition to the drafted mask mandate for MCPS schools for the 2021-2022 school year.

The word choice is described as the right, power or opportunity to choose. As parents, we make choices all day every day that we think are best for our children. Our job is to assess risks and keep our children safe (mentally & physically) in the best way we feel possible. To be denied the right to make this choice for our children is heartbreaking. They will spend more hours at school between September and June than anywhere else and to know the majority of those hours will once again be spent without seeing their friends or teachers faces, without being able to communicate non-verbally, without feeling as free as they have the past 2 months is crushing to me as a parent. I work with a group of athletes at Big Sky High School and I can tell you with 100% certainty, forcing them to wear a mask instead of giving them the choice whether or not to do so makes a mental difference that I cannot put into words.

All summer I've seen staff & students in & out of the school for meetings, sports practices, weight lifting, etc. without masks and so far have yet to hear of any outbreak. My group in particular is together 2-3x a week and are in constant close guarters (I am the head cheer coach there and we spend 95% of our time stunting). We did not have a single case on our team last year nor have we encountered one this summer. My team understands how effective hand washing. drinking water and eating well are to keep your immune system strong for all germ encounters, not just Covid 19.

Not only am I a fellow MCPS staff member, I'm also the parent of a soon-to-be sophomore and soon-to-be 1st grader. They both had their school years rocked by this virus last year (like so many other students) and I want to do everything in my power to give them every bit of normalcy they deserve. Leaving the choice of masks up to us to discuss as a family is something I feel very strongly about. How will I explain to my 7 year old that he has to wear his the whole time he's in the classroom, but his teacher can remove theirs if they choose, so long as they're 6 ft, away? If the teacher is that far away from students, wouldn't it make sense that the students should also be able to remove their masks?

We have been able to make our own decisions regarding masks for the past 3 months now and while it may seem as though there is a massive outbreak happening again, the numbers simply don't support that thought process. As of today, the Montana DPHHS map shows 188 active cases in Missoula County, with a population of roughly 121,520 people, that puts our positive active cases at 0.15% of our county's population. Map is linked here and is updated every week day. https://montana.maps.arcgis.com/apps/MapSeries/index.html?appid=7c34f3412536439491adcc2103421d4b The age group we are asking to be forced to wear masks is the least affected by this virus. According to the CDC. between 1/4/2020 & 7/31/2021 there have been a total fo 606,390 deaths involving Covid 19 with only 416 of those being between the ages of 0 & 18. That is only 0.069% of all death involving this virus. All other deaths averaged 4 other contributing factors to the death, Listed here under "Comorbidities and other conditions" https://www.cdc.gov/nchs/nvss/vsrr/covid\_weekly/index.htm#SexAndAge Scientifically, it does not make sense to go to these extreme measures for these age groups. Our children's immune systems are brilliant but they are not able to work properly under these measures. They need to be exposed to a certain number of germs and bacteria to learn to do their jobs.

In addition to my role as a coach at Big Sky, I also work at Community Medical Center and would like to address another bit of misinformation regarding this virus and hospitalization. At this moment, our community is under the impression that our hospitals are at capacity or close to it because of positive Covid patients and that could not be farther from the truth. Yes, we have positive cases being hospitalized but that is not the reason we are having to go on divert (sending patients to other nearby hospitals). We, like SO MANY other businesses in town, are incredibly short staffed. We have 33 beds on our Med/Surg unit, but just a few weeks ago had to go on divert when we only had 15 beds full (with 0 of them being Covid positive) because we simply don't have the staff to safely handle more patients.

Lastly, I will leave you with a short 6 minute YouTube clip of an Indiana Doctor of Functional & Family medicine addressing a local school board on their own Covid mandate and protocol. He's intelligent, well spoken, and brings to light why our current mitigations aren't working. Dear Missoula County Public School Board,

I'm writing in support of universal masking in Missoula County Public Schools for the 2021-2022 year.

We all recognize that students learn best in person, and that a return to the classroom is important for students' academic and emotional wellbeing. However, the medical community nationwide has also seen a rise in pediatric COVID-19 cases. and we are experiencing a rapid increase in Covid cases in Montana due to the delta variant. The long-term negative effects of COVID-19 in both children and adults is also an area of active research and concern.

Universal masking is safe and effective, and can help students and staff return to school together with minimal interruptions. While vaccines are the most important step for individual and community protection and dramatically reduce severe cases of Covid, they are not available to children under 12, and may not entirely reduce transmission of the more contagious delta variant. Requiring or policing vaccine status among older students and staff is also not practically feasible.

Over the past week I have collected signatures from Montana residents who are in favor of school mask mandates per CDC and AAP guidelines, and who wanted to express their support for local school board control to State Superintendent Arntzen and Governor Gianforte. The results of this petition have been delivered to both state offices, and since 52.9% of the respondents were from Missoula, I thought you would like to see them as well in advance of tomorrow's meeting. We had 787 respondents who gave a Missoula County zip code, out of a total of 1486 responses. This petition not only indicates strong support for mask mandates for MCPS, but strong statewide support (contrary to the narrative that Missoula is alone in this position). A full list of signatures has been provided to each member of the MCPS school board.

The text of the petition reads:

The signers of this petition support mask mandates in Montana public schools for the Fall 2021 semester. They ask the MT state government to allow school districts the freedom to enact such mandates in accordance with the most recent guidance from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Center for Disease Control.

AAP Guidance, July 19, 2021: "Everything possible must be done to keep students in schools in-person...All students older than 2 years and all school staff should wear face masks at school (unless medical or developmental conditions prohibit use). The AAP recommends universal masking in school at this time for the following reasons:

- -a significant portion of the student population is not eligible for vaccination
- -protection of unvaccinated students from COVID-19 and to reduce transmission
- -lack of a system to monitor vaccine status among students, teachers and staff
- -potential difficulty in monitoring or enforcing mask policies for those who are not vaccinated; in the absence of schools being able to conduct this monitoring, universal masking is the best and most effective strategy to create consistent messages, expectations, enforcement, and compliance without the added burden of needing to monitor vaccination status
- -possibility of low vaccination uptake within the surrounding school community
- -continued concerns for variants that are more easily spread among children, adolescents, and adults"

CDC Guidance, July 27, 2021: "Given new evidence on the B.1.617.2 (Delta) variant, CDC has updated the guidance for fully vaccinated people. CDC recommends universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status. Children should return to full-time in-person learning in the fall with layered prevention strategies in place."

08/02/2021: A lack of mandates that leaves masking "up to parents" actually leaves the issue up to 5-year-olds. As a parent, I can send my kindergartener to school with a mask and talk to her all I want about the importance of wearing it, but at her maturity level it's absurd to think she'll keep it on all day if her friends aren't or if her teacher can't remind her to put it back on after lunch. It's the job of adults to provide the structure and guidance needed to keep children safe. We need a mask mandate for the same reason I don't offer my kid the "option" to have ice cream for dinner, or to play kickball in the street. Kids aren't ready to carry the full responsibility for their safety and risk long-term complications they don't understand, and parents need to know that their teachers are empowered to keep them as safe as possible according to AAP and CDC guidelines. Given Delta's transmission rates, a recent study expects that without masks, 70% of all students will be infected within 3 months, a figure completely beyond the resources of our healthcare system — with mask mandates, that figure drops to 40%, reducing transmission by nearly half and buying time for the vaccine to be approved for ages 5-11.

08/03/2021: After yesterday's meeting I watched a press conference by Dr. Mark Kline, Physician-in-Chief at Children's Hospital New Orleans. He dispelled the myth that only children with pre-existing conditions are getting sick, saying: "Half the children we are seeing [hospitalized] with COVID were perfectly healthy." He goes on to say "This delta variant is every infectious disease specialist's worst nightmare.. There was a myth.. that children were somehow immune... It has become very clear that children are heavily impacted." You know, during the best case/worst case exercise yesterday and today I heard a lot of worst case scenarios that boil down to "what if people get mad at us." You want to know my worst case scenario? My kid brings covid home to my newborn and either one of them is hospitalized, or gets long covid. Or the pediatric ICUs fill up and my kid gets appendicitis or my newborn gets RSV. Or we lose our apartment during a housing crisis due to covid medical bills or tons of missed work due to repeated covid exposures. The CDC reports that over 200,000 children have been hospitalized with covid, pre-delta variant. Rates of hospitalization and disability affect children's mental health, as does the fear of bringing covid home to at-risk family members. The British National Health Service says 7-8% of children experience long covid, and preliminary research suggests it's caused by long-term neurological damage.\* Yesterday some commenters referenced a study in Germany purporting to show elevated CO2 levels due to masks, I got curious and looked up the study, and found out that it has since been retracted. The equipment they used to measure the CO2 levels was used incorrectly. Pulse oximeter data while masking has consistently shown CO2 levels within acceptable limits. While some people do experience a sense of breathlessness while masking, it is psychological, not physiological. As someone who experienced an anxiety disorder myself as a teen, I have a lot of sympathy for that. But I also know from personal experience that we know how to treat anxiety in children and teens. We don't know how to treat long covid, or even if we will be able to. Last year we had three cases per 100k at the end of August, and we saw a giant wave within months. Today we saw we're at 18 per 100k and on on the rise, and delta is as contagious as chicken pox. We need masks. Nobody should have the right to expose my kid to a disease that's only getting more dangerous for kids.

08/10/2021: Because we don't have school transmission data on the delta variant, and news out of other states indicates it impacts kids worse, please keep the mask mandate for the first 6-8 weeks while we gather local data. We can reassess once we have a better picture of what delta looks like in our community. A leaked CDC internal document says the battle has changed against covid as a result of delta, and we don't want to go in underprepared. Utah is hospitalizing a child under 12 every other day and expects the rate to increase. Louisiana and Arkansas pediatric hospitals are at capacity with children with tubes down their throats, half of whom had no pre-existing conditions. The Governor of Arkansas has been on the news regretting opposing masks and begging schools to implement mandates. Four Mississippi schools so far have already had to go online after only one or two weeks without masks. An intubated 11-month old couldn't find a hospital bed at the largest children's hospital in the nation in Houston and had to be airlifted 150 miles away. Child hospitalizations are at their highest rate in the whole pandemic. We're incredibly lucky to not be the first state hit with this variant, and we should learn the lessons of other states while we still can. A study in the Lancet suggests 1 in 22 kids experience long covid — that's one kid from every class acquiring a disability.

My family doesn't have the option to do online learning — we can't afford to have a parent lose work hours supervising that. We need our kid to be safe in school and not let cases build up to the point where we have to get back to phase 1 or 2. And let's not pretend recommending masks means all parents who want kids masked can keep them masked. My kindergartner isn't going to keep her mask on all day if her friends aren't because she's 5 and she isn't capable of long-term reasoning yet. Young children benefit from 100% consistency, not a hodgepodge of different rules for different families, and at that age I don't even have the choice to protect her via

vaccination. Masks are her only line of defense and she deserves a school experience that supports that. It's truly a difficult situation that no matter what the policy is, there's no solution here where individual choice occurs in a consequence-free vacuum. The founding fathers understood that in a healthy society, freedom is more complicated than doing whatever we want. Even George Washington mandated inoculation at Valley Forge and advised the Virginia legislature to mandate childhood inoculation,\* and some of the strongest local government measures in the revolutionary era were about preventing disease outbreaks. Public schools and public health is about the public good, and that's what the CDC and AAP guidelines are all about.

\*George Washington wrote in 1777: "If I was a Member of that [Virginia] Assembly I would rather move for a Law to compell the Masters of Families to inoculate every Child born within a certain limitted time under severe Penalties."

It is a small and simple step to take to protect yourselves and others around you. People are not being asked to wear haz-mat suits and rubber gloves. It's a mask through which you can breathe.

Do you wear your seatbelt? Does it protect you 'just in case'? Do you follow the rules by not smoking on school grounds because it's a risk to yourself and others? Did you get polio last month? Last year? In your lifetime?

Please base your decision on facts, not on emotions. I don't envy your need to make this decision but I will be impacted by it. I am hoping that impact will come in the form of my family, friends, co-workers and me being able to remain COVID-free because my employer and my community recognized the need to mask-up!

Please don't let this COVID variant get a foothold in Missoula.

Dear Missoula County Board of Trustees:

There is nothing we want more than our son to have a normal high school experience. We don't want him to wear a mask all day at school and we want him to be able to freely socialize with other kids and make new friends in the classroom and during extracurricular activities. We want spectators to attend his basketball games. We want to attend his band concerts and for him to see smiles in the audience. We want him to go to social events like the prom and Homecoming and to be able to see the expressions on his friends' faces.

We don't want him to wear a mask at school. No one wants their child to wear a mask at school. But it's going to be necessary due to more contagious variants-- unless we add COVID vaccines to the list of required vaccinations for students 12 and older and staff. Many of us have unvaccinated family members or high risk family members who are vaccinated and are still at risk, so we need to continue wearing masks for the time being. But, if we mandate that all Missoula County Public School staff and students 12 years old and older get the COVID vaccine, mask wearing may not be necessary at our high schools.

We understand that the Montana legislature has banned public school systems in Montana from requiring the COVID vaccine for eligible students. This is a morally repugnant directive and will likely end up being decided in the courts. In the meantime, we believe the Missoula County Public School system has a moral imperative to issue a COVID vaccine requirement in order to protect everyone in the community. Medical and religious exemptions for COVID vaccines will still be available to anyone who wants to make that argument, but with a requirement in place, the vast majority of students would be vaccinated and therefore provide substantial protection to the student body, and their friends and families. The scientific evidence is clear that face coverings offer significant protection when all are wearing them, but the vastly more contagious Delta variant of COVID has rendered them less effective. Vaccination provides much greater protection even against the Delta variant. It's clear that the only path forward is a vaccine requirement for all eligible students. By not requiring it this year, we are guaranteeing there will be more unnecessary and preventable disease and death in our community. It's inevitable despite the negligent actions of our state legislature, that a COVID vaccine will be required for public school students at some point.

Let's be ahead of that curve and do it now, in the interest of protecting our community. The highly effective vaccines that are readily available and free of charge have given us an opportunity to keep our students safe and have a normal school experience. Our hearts break thinking that our son may never have a normal high school experience.

Dear MCPS Trustees,

I am writing to you in my capacities as a physician in our community, an MCPS parent of two COVID-vaccinated students (ages 12 and 14) and as the physician member of the Missoula City-County Board of Health.

As you are well aware, we are experiencing another uptick in COVID disease activity, including increased hospitalizations and deaths. This increase is being fueled by the delta variant, which has shown an increased ability to be transmitted, even among vaccinated individuals. While universal vaccination is the best possible protection against a resurgence of COVID in our community, the majority of our MCPS students will not be eligible for vaccination until sometime in the fall or early winter. Current Missoula County vaccination rates stand at around 30% for 12-14 year olds and 50% for 15-19 year olds.

I strongly urge you to require universal masking for students, teachers and staff in MCPS schools for the start of the fall semester. The CDC, American Academy of Pediatrics and others have issued well-reasoned and researched guidance recommending masking in schools. I understand that this issue is controversial, but the science is clear. Masking is probably one of the most effective and least disruptive COVID mitigation measures available to schools, especially until more of our children are eligible for vaccination. Universal masking in schools is likely to significantly reduce the number of students, teachers and staff who will require absence from school or work for either COVID illness or quarantine after exposure. This is one of the most important things you can do to keep all of our students in school and reduce the transmission of COVID in our community.

As an aside, I would encourage MCPS to do whatever you can to encourage vaccination of all eligible MCPS students. teachers and staff, up to and including vaccination requirements to attend in-person school or participate in extracurricular activities or group travel.

Finally, I would like to applaud all of you for your leadership over the past year. I believe MCPS has been a model for transparency, clarity and public accountability in decisionmaking around COVID. You have made good decisions that have kept our kids in school and protected the public health. Keep up the good work.

Hello,

First I want to thank the Covid task force for the job they've done over the last 18 months. It's no easy task and they've handled the unknown very well.

I'm writing in opposition to the drafted mask mandate for MCPS schools for the 2021-2022 school year.

The word choice is described as the right, power or opportunity to choose. As parents, we make choices all day every day that we think are best for our children. Our job is to assess risks and keep our children safe (mentally & physically) in the best way we feel possible. To be denied the right to make this choice for our children is heartbreaking. They will spend more hours at school between September and June than anywhere else and to know the majority of those hours will once again be spent without seeing their friends or teachers faces, without being able to communicate non-verbally, without feeling as free as they have the past 2 months is crushing to me as a parent. I work with a group of athletes at Big Sky High School and I can tell you with 100% certainty, forcing them to wear a mask instead of giving them the choice whether or not to do so makes a mental difference that I cannot put into words.

All summer I've seen staff & students in & out of the school for meetings, sports practices, weight lifting, etc. without masks and so far have yet to hear of any outbreak. My group in particular is together 2-3x a week and are in constant close quarters (I am the head cheer coach there and we spend 95% of our time stunting). We did not have a single case on our team last year nor have we encountered one this summer. My team understands how effective hand washing, drinking water and eating well are to keep your immune system strong for all germ encounters, not just Covid 19.

Not only am I a fellow MCPS staff member, I'm also the parent of a soon-to-be sophomore and soon-to-be 1st grader. They both had their school years rocked by this virus last year (like so many other students) and I want to do everything in my power to give them every bit of normalcy they deserve. Leaving the choice of masks up to us to discuss as a family is something I feel very strongly about. How will I explain to my 7 year old that he has to wear his the whole time he's in the classroom, but his teacher can remove theirs if they choose, so long as they're 6 ft. away? If the teacher is that far away from students, wouldn't it make sense that the students should also be able to remove their masks?

We have been able to make our own decisions regarding masks for the past 3 months now and while it may seem as though there is a massive outbreak happening again, the numbers simply don't support that thought process. As of today, the Montana DPHHS map shows 188 active cases in Missoula County, with a population of roughly 121,520 people, that puts our positive active cases at 0.15% of our county's population. Map is linked here and is updated every week day. https://montana.maps.arcgis.com/apps/MapSeries/index.html?appid=7c34f3412536439491adcc2103421d4b The age group we are asking to be forced to wear masks is the least affected by this virus. According to the CDC, between 1/4/2020 & 7/31/2021 there have been a total fo 606,390 deaths involving Covid 19 with only 416 of those being between the ages of 0 & 18. That is only 0.069% of all death involving this virus. Link here to data:https://data.cdc.gov/ NCHS/Provisional-COVID-19-Deaths-Focus-on-Ages-0-18-Yea/nr4s-juj3 Only 5% of ALL reported Covid 19 deaths, Covid was the only reported conditions. All other deaths averaged 4 other contributing factors to the death. Listed here under "Comorbidities and other conditions" https://www.cdc.gov/nchs/nvss/vsrr/covid\_weekly/index.htm#SexAndAge Scientifically, it does not make sense to go to these extreme measures for these age groups. Our children's immune systems are brilliant but they are not able to work properly under these measures. They need to be exposed to a certain number of germs and bacteria to learn to do their jobs.

In addition to my role as a coach at Big Sky, I also work at Community Medical Center and would like to address another bit of misinformation regarding this virus and hospitalization. At this moment, our community is under the impression that our hospitals are at capacity or close to it because of positive Covid patients and that could not be farther from the truth. Yes, we have positive cases being hospitalized but that is not the reason we are having to go on divert (sending patients to other nearby hospitals). We, like SO MANY other businesses in town, are incredibly short staffed. We have 33 beds on our Med/Surg unit, but just a few weeks ago had to go on divert when we only had 15 beds full (with 0 of them being Covid positive) because we simply don't have the staff to safely handle more patients.

Lastly, I will leave you with a short 6 minute YouTube clip of an Indiana Doctor of Functional & Family medicine addressing a local school board on their own Covid mandate and protocol. He's intelligent, well spoken, and brings to light why our current mitigations aren't working. While vaccines are the most important step for individual and community protection and dramatically reduce severe cases of Covid, they are not available to children under 12, and may not entirely reduce transmission of the more contagious delta variant. Requiring or policing vaccine status among older students and staff is also not practically feasible.

As both a physician and mother of young children, I strongly support masks and a return to in-person learning for our kids. This is in line with recommendations from the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Academy of Family Physicians, and the Centers of Disease Control.

Please prioritize kids in our community by recommending vaccines for those who can take them, and with universal masking in the classroom.

Let's get back to school.

Over the past week I have collected signatures from Montana residents who are in favor of school mask mandates per CDC and AAP guidelines, and who wanted to express their support for local school board control to State Superintendent Arntzen and Governor Gianforte. The results of this petition have been delivered to both state offices, and since 52.9% of the respondents were from Missoula, I thought you would like to see them as well in advance of tomorrow's meeting. We had 787 respondents who gave a Missoula County zip code, out of a total of 1486 responses. This petition not only indicates strong support for mask mandates for MCPS, but strong statewide support (contrary to the narrative that Missoula is alone in this position). A full list of signatures has been provided to each member of the MCPS school board.

The text of the petition reads:

The signers of this petition support mask mandates in Montana public schools for the Fall 2021 semester. They ask the MT state government to allow school districts the freedom to enact such mandates in accordance with the most recent guidance from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Center for Disease Control.

AAP Guidance, July 19, 2021: "Everything possible must be done to keep students in schools in-person...All students older than 2 years and all school staff should wear face masks at school (unless medical or developmental conditions prohibit use). The AAP recommends universal masking in school at this time for the following reasons:

- -a significant portion of the student population is not eligible for vaccination
- -protection of unvaccinated students from COVID-19 and to reduce transmission
- -lack of a system to monitor vaccine status among students, teachers and staff
- -potential difficulty in monitoring or enforcing mask policies for those who are not vaccinated; in the absence of schools being able to conduct this monitoring, universal masking is the best and most effective strategy to create consistent messages, expectations, enforcement, and compliance without the added burden of needing to monitor vaccination status
- -possibility of low vaccination uptake within the surrounding school community
- -continued concerns for variants that are more easily spread among children, adolescents, and adults"

CDC Guidance, July 27, 2021: "Given new evidence on the B.1.617.2 (Delta) variant, CDC has updated the guidance for fully vaccinated people. CDC recommends universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status. Children should return to full-time in-person learning in the fall with layered prevention strategies in place."

08/02/2021: A lack of mandates that leaves masking "up to parents" actually leaves the issue up to 5-year-olds. As a parent, I can send my kindergartener to school with a mask and talk to her all I want about the importance of wearing it, but at her maturity level it's absurd to think she'll keep it on all day if her friends aren't or if her teacher can't remind her to put it back on after lunch. It's the job of adults to provide the structure and guidance needed to keep children safe. We need a mask mandate for the same reason I don't offer my kid the "option" to have ice cream for dinner, or to play kickball in the street. Kids aren't ready to carry the full responsibility for their safety and risk long-term complications they don't understand, and parents need to know that their teachers are empowered to keep them as safe as possible according to AAP and CDC guidelines. Given Delta's transmission rates, a recent study expects that without masks, 70% of all students will be infected within 3 months, a figure completely beyond the resources of our healthcare system — with mask mandates, that figure drops to 40%, reducing transmission by nearly half and buying time for the vaccine to be approved for ages 5-11.

08/03/2021: After yesterday's meeting I watched a press conference by Dr. Mark Kline, Physician-in-Chief at Children's Hospital New Orleans. He dispelled the myth that only children with pre-existing conditions are getting sick, saying: "Half the children we are seeing [hospitalized] with COVID were perfectly healthy." He goes on to say "This delta variant is every infectious disease specialist's worst nightmare.. There was a myth.. that children were somehow immune... It has become very clear that children are heavily impacted." You know, during the best case/worst case exercise yesterday and today I heard a lot of worst case scenarios that boil down to "what if people get mad at us." You want to know my worst case scenario? My kid brings covid home to my newborn and either one of them is hospitalized, or gets long covid. Or the pediatric ICUs fill up and my kid gets appendicitis or my newborn gets RSV. Or we lose our apartment during a housing crisis due to covid medical bills or tons of missed work due to repeated covid exposures. The CDC reports that over 200,000 children have been hospitalized with covid, pre-delta variant. Rates of hospitalization and disability affect children's mental health, as does the fear of bringing covid home to at-risk family members. The British National Health Service says 7-8% of children experience long covid, and preliminary research suggests it's caused by long-term neurological damage.\* Yesterday some commenters referenced a study in Germany purporting to show elevated CO2 levels due to masks, I got curious and looked up the study, and found out that it has since been retracted. The equipment they used to measure the CO2 levels was used incorrectly. Pulse oximeter data while masking has consistently shown CO2 levels within acceptable limits. While some people do experience a sense of breathlessness while masking, it is psychological, not physiological. As someone who experienced an anxiety disorder myself as a teen, I have a lot of sympathy for that. But I also know from personal experience that we know how to treat anxiety in children and teens. We don't know how to treat long covid, or even if we will be able to. Last year we had three cases per 100k at the end of August, and we saw a giant wave within months. Today we saw we're at 18 per 100k and on on the rise, and delta is as contagious as chicken pox. We need masks. Nobody should have the right to expose my kid to a disease that's only getting more dangerous for kids.

08/10/2021: Because we don't have school transmission data on the delta variant, and news out of other states indicates it impacts kids worse, please keep the mask mandate for the first 6-8 weeks while we gather local data. We can reassess once we have a better picture of what delta looks like in our community. A leaked CDC internal document says the battle has changed against covid as a result of delta, and we don't want to go in underprepared. Utah is hospitalizing a child under 12 every other day and expects the rate to increase. Louisiana and Arkansas pediatric hospitals are at capacity with children with tubes down their throats, half of whom had no pre-existing conditions. The Governor of Arkansas has been on the news regretting opposing masks and begging schools to implement mandates. Four Mississippi schools so far have already had to go online after only one or two weeks without masks. An intubated 11-month old couldn't find a hospital bed at the largest children's hospital in the nation in Houston and had to be airlifted 150 miles away. Child hospitalizations are at their highest rate in the whole pandemic. We're incredibly lucky to not be the first state hit with this variant, and we should learn the lessons of other states while we still can. A study in the Lancet suggests 1 in 22 kids experience long covid — that's one kid from every class acquiring a disability.

My family doesn't have the option to do online learning — we can't afford to have a parent lose work hours supervising that. We need our kid to be safe in school and not let cases build up to the point where we have to get back to phase 1 or 2. And let's not pretend recommending masks means all parents who want kids masked can keep them masked. My kindergartner isn't going to keep her mask on all day if her friends aren't because she's 5 and she isn't capable of long-term reasoning yet. Young children benefit from 100% consistency, not a hodgepodge of different rules for different families, and at that age I don't even have the choice to protect her via

vaccination. Masks are her only line of defense and she deserves a school experience that supports that. It's truly a difficult situation that no matter what the policy is, there's no solution here where individual choice occurs in a consequence-free vacuum. The founding fathers understood that in a healthy society, freedom is more complicated than doing whatever we want. Even George Washington mandated inoculation at Valley Forge and advised the Virginia legislature to mandate childhood inoculation,\* and some of the strongest local government measures in the revolutionary era were about preventing disease outbreaks. Public schools and public health is about the public good, and that's what the CDC and AAP guidelines are all about.

\*George Washington wrote in 1777: "If I was a Member of that [Virginia] Assembly I would rather move for a Law to compell the Masters of Families to inoculate every Child born within a certain limitted time under severe Penalties."

Thank you for your service to our community. Your work over the last 17 months has surely been more than you bargained for when you volunteered to be on the Board. Your efforts are greatly appreciated.

Throughout the entire pandemic, this Board has made tough decisions based on the most current data for the benefit of our students and everyone in our community with whom they come in contact. The Delta variant presents another such opportunity. Although it is difficult to revoke freedoms, we know that masks, social distancing, hand washing and staying home when you don't feel well are the basic actions we can all take when we are in public to minimize the spread of this strain of COVID. Those are the precautions that all of us took to reduce new infections prior to vaccines being available and we should implement those precautions again with the awareness that Delta is a more transmissible strain, even amongst those who are vaccinated. Both the CDC and our local health department are strongly recommending returning to masking.

Dear Missoula County Board of Trustees:

There is nothing we want more than our son to have a normal high school experience. We don't want him to wear a mask all day at school and we want him to be able to freely socialize with other kids and make new friends in the classroom and during extracurricular activities. We want spectators to attend his basketball games. We want to attend his band concerts and for him to see smiles in the audience. We want him to go to social events like the prom and Homecoming and to be able to see the expressions on his friends' faces.

We don't want him to wear a mask at school. No one wants their child to wear a mask at school. But it's going to be necessary due to more contagious variants-- unless we add COVID vaccines to the list of required vaccinations for students 12 and older and staff. Many of us have unvaccinated family members or high risk family members who are vaccinated and are still at risk, so we need to continue wearing masks for the time being. But, if we mandate that all Missoula County Public School staff and students 12 years old and older get the COVID vaccine, mask wearing may not be necessary at our high schools.

We understand that the Montana legislature has banned public school systems in Montana from requiring the COVID vaccine for eligible students. This is a morally repugnant directive and will likely end up being decided in the courts. In the meantime, we believe the Missoula County Public School system has a moral imperative to issue a COVID vaccine requirement in order to protect everyone in the community. Medical and religious exemptions for COVID vaccines will still be available to anyone who wants to make that argument, but with a requirement in place, the vast majority of students would be vaccinated and therefore provide substantial protection to the student body, and their friends and families. The scientific evidence is clear that face coverings offer significant protection when all are wearing them, but the vastly more contagious Delta variant of COVID has rendered them less effective. Vaccination provides much greater protection even against the Delta variant. It's clear that the only path forward is a vaccine requirement for all eligible students. By not requiring it this year, we are guaranteeing there will be more unnecessary and preventable disease and death in our community. It's inevitable despite the negligent actions of our state legislature, that a COVID vaccine will be required for public school students at some point.

Let's be ahead of that curve and do it now, in the interest of protecting our community. The highly effective vaccines that are readily available and free of charge have given us an opportunity to keep our students safe and have a normal school experience. Our hearts break thinking that our son may never have a normal high school experience.
