HAWKS GET LICE TOO!

Since head lice is not uncommon in school age children, the district wants to remind parents of resources and the school procedures which are located on the district website (www.mcpsmt.org) ⇒ student services ⇒ health services ⇒ head lice. You may also contact the family resource centers or the school nurse for written information or resources.

Remember that:

- People usually don't have symptoms of having head lice for several weeks after becoming infested. A common symptom is itching which is also common with dandruff and dry skin.
- People get head lice from other infested people mostly when they have head to head contact as head lice do not fly, swim or jump.
- It's easier to treat head lice when found "early" so checking hair for head lice at home is important for any symptoms or even periodically.

MCPS OPERATIONS LEVIES

This is an all mail election. Ballots were mailed on April 18th and must be turned in by May 8th, 2018. These levies allow MCPS to sustain current staffing and programs. Due to a Building Reserve levy that is sunsetting and additional funding from the state, the total taxpayer cost to fund the high school district will go down even if the voted levy passes.
