I hope that in this class you will develop your own appreciation of cultural and linguistic diversity. In Spanish class, we will practice behaviors that translate to our roles within global society. Beginning in our classroom we can practice **tolerance**, **integrity**, and **respect** so that we can extend the same thoughtfulness to our interactions within the global community. We all must meet the following expectations on a daily basis. Remember that each of us is entitled to a *safe*, *enjoyable*, and *productive* learning environment.

This class is EQUIVALENT TO A 200-LEVEL SPANISH COLLEGE COURSE. The whole school year we follow the IB format. If you are interested in taking the AP-culture and language exam please talk me as soon as possible.

OIFCTIVES

- To understand the significant events that created the current world in which we live.
- To develop critical thinking, communication, and writing skills.
- To learn to be an effective leader as well as an effective team player.
- To learn to be inquirers.

CLASS EXPECTATIONS

- If you need to have bite of your food you are so welcome to step out of the classroom and help yourself. If you start eating during class, I'll ask you to step out and finish your food outside.
- In this class your phone will be a tool, If you don't have one is not a big deal, I have other tools you can use instead to do the activities where a phone is need it. Please read the expectations for cellphone use:
 - ✓ Phone will be used for research, video, voice memo, screen recording, and sometime for listening to music
 - ✓ <u>Use of social media on phones and computers during class is not allowed.</u> If you use your phone or computer during class to check your social media points will be deducted. PLEASE KNOW THAT IF YOU ARE ON SOCIAL MEDIA DURING CLASS POINTS WILL BE DEDUCTED AND YOUR GRADE WILL BE AFFECTED
 - ✓ When we are doing hands on activities, please have your phone out of sight. Make sure the volume is on if you are expecting a call, so you can go outside the room to use it.

When you take a hall pass or go to the bathroom, leave your phone in your backpack if you worry about getting distracted by it while you are out of the classroom.

- Be in your seat, with your materials, ready to go when the bell rings. Please check "absences" and "tardies" to know the expectations regarding these subjects.
- RESPECT YOURSELF, YOUR TIME AND YOUR POTENTIAL.

If you <u>choose</u> not to meet the expectations above, or if your behavior compromises the *learning, happiness*, or *safety* of your classmates, your grade will be affected and you will simultaneously <u>choose</u> the following consequences:

ABSENCES

If you are not in class in the first 15 minutes you will be marked absent.

If you know you will be absent on a certain date, please let me know. I'll post all materials, information, and homework every day on Google Classroom with instructions on how to turn them in!! It is your responsibility to manage your work. Please talk to me and make a plan together. Remember, when you are gone, for the most, **You still need to turn in your work on time on Google Classroom or by email, copy the notes you have missed, and work on assignments.**

If the absence was unexpected and you didn't let me know, send me an email and talk with a classmate to find out details about what you have missed. Please know you must make arrangements <u>the day you return to class</u> to make up tests and quizzes for full credit. You have one week. This is <u>your</u> responsibility.

TARDIES

You are TARDY if you are not in your seat and actively working on the warm-up when the bell rings. You are allowed 3 "free" late arrivals per quarter. More than 5 tardies will require administrative action. If you are not in class when the bell rigs, you will be marked tardy.

HALL PASSES

Consistent, regular attendance is crucial to your success in this class. Please use hall passes sparingly, only when absolutely necessary. DO NOT interrupt instruction to ask to leave the room. Wait until an appropriate time to leave (when students are working independently, <u>not</u> when instructor is speaking or teaching). Always ask to leave the class IN SPANISH. ©

Hellgate uses a BLUE CARD system. If you are having a bad day and cannot focus through your emotions or circumstances, you may utilize the following steps:

STEP 1: Take a 5-minute break outside the classroom, away from other people. Just tell me what you need, then step outside, decompress and **breathe**. Join us again as soon as you can.

STEP 2: If this doesn't work – if you can't re-engage with class after your 5-minute decompression – you may request a blue card. You'll take the blue card to the ISI room on the second floor. There you'll find space and the resources to help you take control of your day.

HOMEWORK & LATE WORK.

To get a 100%, all homework and assignments need to be turned in <u>at the start of class</u> of the due date in class or on Google Classroom. Late homework will be accepted with a 50% penalty until the school-wide deadlines. There are very few exceptions to this policy, so BE DILIGENT with your work. After the school-wide deadlines for late or missing work no work will be accepted

ACADEMIC HONESTY

Do not cheat. Do not plagiarize (claim someone else's written work as your own). These offenses WILL result in <u>zero credit</u> on the assessment or assignment, a phone call home, and a referral to the administration.

TECHNOLOGY

We will use the following websites and tools with regularity:

- <u>WordReference.com</u> The best online translator for looking up words, <u>Conjuguemos.com</u> Powerful website for practicing grammar, especially verb conjugations, and <u>https://kahoot.com</u>, and Jeopardy for reviews and games.
- **G Suite** You will use Google Earth, Docs, Slides, Cites, Google Classroom, and Gmail to do your presentations and to get all your information regarding notes, assignments, instructions, deadlines and turn in your work.

Using **online translators like Google Translate** to write in Spanish presents a significant issue. If you use an online translator to translate groups of *more than one word at a time* – and I WILL know if you do because it's very obvious – you will receive NO CREDIT for your work. This qualifies as plagiarism. You might need to look up one or two new vocabulary words, and that's fine; you may use an online translator to do so. However, if you use the translator to conjugate your verbs, to write a whole sentence / paragraph / essay, you will NOT receive credit for your work. *BE CAREFUL and ask me for guidance if this confuses you!*

MATERIALS

You will need the following materials in this class:

- 1. Pencil
- 2. Colored pen(s)
- 3. Index cards (for making vocabulary flashcards)
- 4. A three-ring binder or section in a binder devoted just to Spanish + paper
- 5. A Spanish cuaderno (binder) that should be divided into the following labeled sections: Introducciones (daily warm-ups). Apuntes (notes). Vocabulario (vocabulary lists). Gramática (grammar rules)

Only standard letter grades (A, B, C, D, F) will be given (no plusses or minuses).

tests (oral, written, listening, and reading) AND final exams. THERE ARE FOUR FINAL EXAMS (oral, written, listening, and reading)

Formative Assessments (20%)

Presentations, quizzes, pop quizzes, assignments checked for <u>accuracy / correctness</u>, projects, compositions.

Practice and Participation (20%)

homework / assignments checked for <u>completion</u>, warm-ups, positive daily contribution to and engagement in class

(a) How to score well on your **SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENTS** (the things that show WHAT YOU'VE LEARNED):

STUDY to pass this class you need to study at least 20 minutes every day (beyond doing your homework or cramming for tests) – flashcards work wonderfully, study your notes, study with a partner or family member, etc. PREPARE yourself for tests and final exams. You will know the structure of the test and exam at the start of the year. PRACTICE You will know the structure of the test and exam at the start of the year. Please practice as much as you can so you can do your best at the day of the test or exam.

(b) How to earn credit on your **FORMATIVE ASSESSMENTS** (the things that show WHERE YOU ARE in the process of learning):

DO your presentations and other assigned projects. Be organized with your notes. It's that simple. Do it *on time* and do your *own work*. **NEVER USE ELECTRONIC / ONLINE TRANSLATORS** to do more than look up individual words. **STRIVE** to meet all daily, weekly, and unit objectives. **GET HELP** when you need it! I HAVE TUTORS FOR YOU.

(c) How to earn credit for **PRACTICE AND PARTICIPATION** (the things that show your commitment to the class community and language learning):

DO the warm-ups every day. **ORGANIZE** your notes, vocab lists, etc.**DO** your homework. **PARTICIPATE** in class and **be** creative! **COMPLETE** all extra activities.

There will be optional assignments that can give you points if you do them, but not extra points or last minute assignments.

If you are a little lost, struggling, or feeling behind in this class, please talk to me with any questions or concerns that you have now or throughout the semester. There are so many tools you can use to get better prepared, so you can do your best. Let's make a plan (tutor, reviews, extra time for assignments, etc.) as soon as possible. At the end of the semester or year it's quit impossible to go up a grade even if you score a's on all finals. I look forward to working with you this year!

Please be patient with yourself, your classmates, and your teacher during the process. Be brave and know that no one in this class will ever judge you for your efforts. Please extend this very important courtesy to each of your classmates – refrain from judging, ridiculing, or otherwise harming the confidence of your peers.
