



How Can Parents Help?

1. Stay involved.

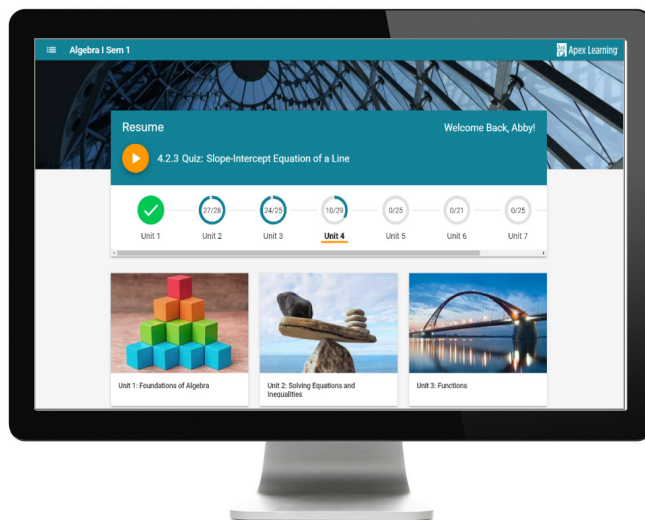
Ask your student to show you what they are learning. Information is presented to students in a variety of ways – through text, audio, video, graphics, and interactives. Have them show you their grade to date and progress from the student dashboard.

2. “Where’s that password again?”

Your student will receive a unique username and password for Apex Learning. Make sure the sign in information is written down and easily available.

3. Know where students can find help when needed.

There are multiple ways for your student to get help with their Apex Courses. Support for reading and understanding can be found within each lesson in the form of reading support cards, graphic organizers, and read aloud text to name a few examples.
