# **ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS**

## The teacher will:

- Establish an engaging Daily 5 framework that promotes literacy independence and student choice.
- Implement an integrated daily reading and writing resource that utilizes authentic literary and informational texts for all learners.
- Administer a formative reading assessment, IRLA, to deliver specific actional instruction around student reading behaviors.

## The parents will:

#### The student will:

- Engage with authentic text by applying close reading skills and transferring these skills into their writing.
- Discuss the texts through engaging learning structures to promote higher level comprehension and connections to text.

## **MATH**

#### The teacher will:

- Use research-based instructional strategies to engage students in higher level computational and problem-solving skills.
- Directly teach and assess mathematical practice standards within each daily math lesson.

#### The parents will:

- Provide a consistent time and place for the student's independent math practice.
- Find opportunities for students to connect mathematical concepts within the world around them.

## The student will:

- Closely analyze mathematical problems by using mathematical practice standards, which include problemsolving and quantitative reasoning.
- Use mathematical practice standards to share and criticize different solutions to grade level math problems.
