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Welcome to a new year!! Chemistry is the study of matter – its composition, structure, and reactions. Chemistry influences so much of our lives. A good knowledge of chemistry ties all of the branches of science together and helps us better understand biology, geology, ecology, physics, astronomy, and more. We will cover many new concepts using a variety of methods including reading, discussion, laboratory activities, audiovisuals, and direct observation. You will be expected to attend class regularly, be prepared for class each day, and always do your best. The course work in this class is <u>cumulative</u>, therefore it is very important to your success to attend class daily and not fall behind.

Class Policies:

Grading:

We do not use a textbook and you will be adding information to your notebook all year, so it is very important to stay organized and bring your notebook daily. On most tests and quizzes, you will be able to use your notebook as a reference – stay organized. I may collect your notebooks at the end of each quarter. You will also need to have a **calculator** for this class.

You will be graded on laboratory reports, class projects, writing assignments, quizzes, and quarterly exams. It is very important that you keep up with daily work. If you are absent, it is <u>your</u> responsibility to arrange make-up as soon as possible.

Your grades can be found on Q. If you feel that your grade is in error, you must produce the assignment paper before your grade will be changed. Keep your papers throughout the year.

Equipment

Your assigned desk and lab drawer are your responsibilities. Keep them neat and clean at all times. Handle all lab materials with care. At the end of the period, lock you lab drawer, return your key to the key board, push the stool in, dispose of garbage, and return materials as directed.

Tardies

Excessive tardies will be handles as outlined in the student handbook.

Attendance Policy

Late Work
