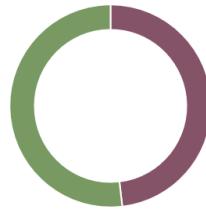

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



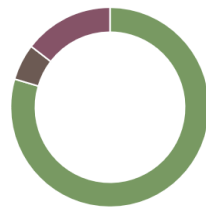
- Male 52%

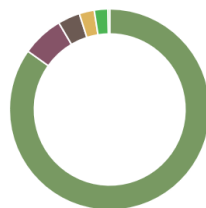

PRE-SCHOOL AND EARLY KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS

EARLY LEARNING PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

A part-time program with specially designed instruction for children ages 3-5 who have been identified as eligible for Special Education Services and Supports; the program is extended two to three days a week to typically functioning peers through an application process. One day a week we offer a Communication Club for students who need support with verbal communication skills.

EARLY KINDERGARTEN:

A full day program for children who are four years old. Enrollment in early kindergarten happens through an application process with first priority being given to families who meet the following criteria:

- 200% of poverty level
- Reside in the Franklin, Lowell, Hawthorne, and Russell attendance areas
- 4 years old, on or before September 10th of current school year
