Connect 5 User Manual



What

BLACKBOARD CONNECT 5 is the newest version of our mass notification service. We use this service to send:

Emergency Messages about safety and security issues, school closures and urgent information.

Outreach Messages about school events, important school dates and meetings.

Connect 5 will enable us to:

- Send messages faster and easier than ever
 - Streamlined, one-page message sending workflow
 - o Custom, pre-set scenario templates; send a message in just a few clicks
 - Expanded message reach via Facebook, Twitter and RSS
- Deliver more targeted and relevant content
 - o Customizable community portal and group subscriptions
 - o Enhanced geo-mapping tools
 - Real-time message delivery reports

Why

We are switching to **Connect 5 because** Alert Now will be phased-out of service by Blackboard. In addition, MCPS had limited ability to send messages to multiple contacts per family with our old Alert Now system.

MCPS is expanding our ability to efficiently reach out to our students' families and our community. **Connect 5**, along with several key adjustments to our Student Information System "Q", will streamline communication with families and your school community. Eventually, your teachers will be able to select contact groups for their classes and send messages directly to their parent and student lists.

The shift to **Connect 5** will allow schools and teachers to push content in emails directly to their Facebook pages and Twitter feeds.

In the 2014-15 school year, we will enable teachers to send messages to the students and families in each of their classes.

When


By January 21, 2014, MCPS will officially transition away from Alert Now and use Connect 5 as our exclusive mass notification service.


February through June, be prepared to receive extra calls from parents wondering why they are now receiving more emails and phone calls and eventually texts from your school.


- 1) Ask if they want to receive emergency messages from the school.
- **2)** Ask if they want to receive outreach messages from the school.
- **3)** Make adjustments in Q to flag their record appropriately.


By August 1, 2014 District Enrollment Forms and all school-based contact update forms should be updated to allow parents to opt-in their phone, email and mobile phones for receiving messages from the school.


By **August 1**, **2014**, all teaching staff will have class lists pre-loaded to allow them to send messages to the students and families in each of their classes.





















SMS Text Message





When to send...

Outreach Messages: School buildings can determine what level of tolerance your school community has for the use of phone messages. In general, if you have a large portion of families who do not have access to email, consider sending phone messages for all OUTREACH messages.	Optional	Optional	No

Basic types of outreach messages:

- · First day of school welcome message
- Reminders when school lets out early or is closed for holidays
- Invitations to school functions/events (and reminders about the events)
- Scheduling parent/teacher conferences
- Celebrations about school accomplishments
- Notice about building drills
- End of school year message

Basic types of emergency messages:

- Issues that impact student safety during the school day
 - Police activity near the school
 - o Issues that affect student transportation home
 - Health and wellness messages (outbreaks of contagious diseases)
 - Student safety threats

Delivery lists:

Emergency Messages	Outreach Messages
Will be sent to all contacts listed for each student.	Will be sent to all contacts listed as parents/guardians for each student.

Sample Emergency Message:

At this time of year, it is common for wildlife to travel in the corridors around our homes and school buildings.

There have been bear sightings in the Pattee Canyon, South Hills and Miller Creek areas over the past 7-10 days. MCPS received a parent call on the morning of Tuesday October, 8, 2013 about a bear rummaging through trash on East Vista Drive. The bear was observed on Monday afternoon, October 7, 2013.

Please be aware of the wildlife in your area and take precautions for your students as they travel to and from school and school bus stops.

Beach Transportation and Fish Wildlife and Parks representatives are recommending that all children in these areas be accompanied to and from their bus stops by a parent/adult.
