Minutes: Amy made a motion to approve the minutes. Carlett seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Treasurer's Report:

Paid out Speech and Debate, Softball, Track and Tennis. Should be able to pay out Girls' Basketball. There were some coaches who have come to the meeting but could not get a parent to work the closet. Carlett suggested SBC representatives attend the sports meetings and recruit parent representatives. Boys' Basketball and Boys' Soccer trophy cases will be updated. Wrestling, golf, swimming never had a parent work the closet.

After the fall sports end, everything tapers off. We need to get the Booster Club letters in the packet of info that goes home this year. We do not have any significant payouts coming up. We have not met our activity payout this year.

Spirit Closet:

Year-round Activities:

Band – The Wind Ensemble performed a concert before leaving for their trip to New York. They performed well at Carnegie. There were four high school bands that requested to be "graded" during their Carnegie Hall performance. Two received a Silver award and two received a Gold award. Sentinel was one of the Gold award winners. The trip was uneventful. The students seemed to have a good time.

The district band festival was Friday, April 5 and Saturday, April 6.

Sindie felt the best performance for Jazz Band was the night they performed in the hallway (following the Wind Ensemble pre-Carnegie Hall concert).

Choir – Jessica Franks, the choir director was scheduled to attend a Booster Club meeting on one of the nights that was cancelled. She was not re-scheduled.

Robotics – They went to Calgary and won an award: Excellence in Engineering.

Spring Sports:

Softball (Dane Oliver reporting) – The team is young. They are fun to watch. They are fast, athletic girls. The JV games were moved around. They are struggling with JV girls this year. It seems there are not enough players.

Lisa emailed Dustin about what he needs for the new shelter. Dane reported that Dustin is too busy right now to think about it. There is a parent that is taking the lead. Dane let them know they need a plan. And, they need to get bids and will need a building permit. It will probably be next year.

Tennis – No players were cut. They had to cancel their first game due to weather. Other than a weather-related cancellation, they are getting off to a great start:

- Girls beat Flathead 7-1 and tied with Glacier 4-4
- Boys beat Flathead 8-0 and Glacier 8-0
- Girls singles Meredith Murdock won both of her single matches against Flathead (6-3 and 6-0) and Glacier (6-3 and 6-0)
- Girls doubles Lauren and Leanna Badger beat Flathead 6-2 and 6-4 and beat Glacier 6-3 and 6-4
- Boys singles Ethan Violette won 6-0 and 6-0 over Flathead and 6-3 and 6-3 over Glacier
- Boys doubles Cody Curtis and Connor D'Angelo swept doubles with 6-0 and 6-1 against Flathead and 6-0 and 6-0 against Glacier

The team plays Hellgate tomorrow. There is an exhibition meet with Loyola, which will likely be cancelled due to rain.

Dane does not want to pursue doing t-shirts for the invitational meet. It is the first year. He wants to see how it goes.

Track – The team had a meet in Kalispell. It was the same day as the ACT, so no juniors went. Girls won, boys did not. Tomorrow there is a quad. Saturday is the Missoula invite (varsity). The top five athletes will participate. They will not cancel unless there is lightning. The girls do not have any throwers. The girls will be good, but not quite as good as previously.

Trophy Cases:

Lisa had a conversation with Kelly Stensrud. He constructed the other cases. He would charge us \$1,500 just to construct the cases. This does not consider the cost for the exterior design, which was done by Roger (?). We would like the same design as the other trophy cases. The estimated cost is \$6,000.

The board decided to get a closer estimate of cost and then will vote on moving forward with covering the cost. We will find out how much Roger costs and decide if we want to go with them. Roger and Kelly work together. Lisa talked with Kelly. He is going to talk with Roger. They do good work.
