# Sentinel Booster Club Meeting Notes March 12, 2018

## **February Minutes:**

Lisa motioned to approve the minutes. Marria seconded. All approved.

#### **Introduction of Guests:**

Jeremy Laporte, Wrestling - The team came in 6th place at the state tournament. There are a lot of young wrestlers on the team, some of which have never wrestled before. The Sentinel team beat Hellgate and Big Sky. As a result, they got the City Trophy back. It is a large trophy. There is a space for it in the trophy case. Wrestling parents have fulfilled their volunteer commitments.

Jay Jagelski, Boys Basketball - The team had a very successful regular season. The coaches and players did not have a lot of expectations coming in. It is a young team and not the biggest team in the state. There is some talent on the team. They won the division tournament; the first time in 29 years. At state, Sentinel played the two teams that they lost to during the regular season. They only lost by a combined total of 5 points to those teams. They played some good teams. The JV and Freshman teams were undefeated. The varsity was 15-3. They will lose six seniors. The seniors were multi-sport athletes. There were some JV who could have played varsity. Sam Beighle received Gatorade Player of the Year. This is the first time in a while that a Sentinel player received this honor. This was a huge accomplishment for Sam and for the program. Boys' Basketball parents have fulfilled their volunteer commitments.

Madison Lightfield, Spanish Club student - Members of the club are planning on a trip to Costa Rica this spring. This trip is offered every two years. While there they learn Spanish and experience the culture. Students do not have to be in the Spanish Club to go to Costa Rica. Spanish students are prioritized, but non-Spanish students can travel, if there is space. The students have to speak entirely in Spanish while there. It is a good opportunity for the AP students to practice, since they take their AP test a month after returning. The trip is 10 days, including travel. Twenty five students go just from Sentinel. To raise money for the trip, they do fundraising, to include selling Osprey tickets, holding bake sells and working concessions. Some students get part time jobs to help cover the

costs. Faculty include: Dan Lochridge, Sam Dixon and Angel Nordquist. The Spanish Club students have worked the spirit closet and have fulfilled their obligation to receive \$250.

# **Treasurer Report:**

#### **Booster Closet:**

There are no more closet dates scheduled. February was good for sales. We will pick one date for the softball parents to come in and get gear. Marria did not sell anything for the state basketball tournament. Lisa sold to about six people during her shift.

Lisa listed some potential closet dates:

- Track (Glacier on 4/3, Msla Quad on 4/10, divisions 5/17-19) The Booster Club could make some divisional shirts for track. Marria explained she would need power to run the press and make shirts to order. She could instead make screen printed shirts and not make as many for the divisional tournament (May 17-19). The board decided to not sell spirit gear during any of the April dates and to just offer shirts during the division meet.
- Softball (opener 3/27 in Missoula) The Booster Club could sell sweatshirts, t-shirts and chairs at the softball outdoor concession at the beginning of the season.
- Tennis (4/10 against Hellgate) The Booster club does not typically open the closet during tennis matches
- 8th grade promotion (May) It was decided to open the closet during the week of promotion for one day (Tuesday, June 5).

Meadow Hill and C.S. Porter called the Sentinel office and asked for free stuff. Meadow Hill typically pays but Porter does not. We give Meadow Hill more and nicer stuff because they pay. We give them a lot for the \$400 they pay. We try to provide enough so every 8<sup>th</sup> grade student gets something. We will give swag to Porter this year, but next year they will have to pay. Marria will put together swag for each school.
